Pendleton, Feb. 9.—A basketball game will be played here Friday night between the girls' team of the local high school and the Waitsburg girls' team.

The boys' team will play at Walla Walla the same night.

A definite schedule of games to be played here during February has been given out by the local basketball management as follows:

Boys play Walla Walla the 11th, girls play Waitsburg the 11th at Waitsburg, boys at La Grande 17th, boys at Walla Walla 18th, boys at Enterprise 18th, girls at Walla Walla 18th, girls at Athena 19th, Athena girls at Pendleton 23rd, boys at La Grande 25th.

The secretary of the Philadelphia Automobile club predicts that within five years the tollgate blockade in Pennsylvania will be lifted. The state is gradually buying up all toll roads and making them free to the traveling public, a quarter of a million dollars have been set aside for that purpose, says the Oregon Journal.

The toll gate system is a reminder of bygone days and it is a matter of surprise that it still exists in different parts of the United States. Even in Oregon there are a few barricades on the public highway which in the course of a few years will be torn out. A notable one to pass with in the past year was the old Dollar-hide toll road of Ashland. It was put out of existence by the construction of the Pacific highway.

"We agree perfectly with the Journal that these relics of bygone days are still allowed to exist in the United States," says the Elgin Recorder, and goes on: Well do the people of Union county, Oregon, and of Walla Walla valley, which is located in both Oregon and Washington, know that fact, having contended with a toll road for almost the last half century. The Woodward toll road running from Elgin to Milton-Freewater and other points in Walla Walla valley is truly a barrier to traffic and a disgrace to

our present civilization, and it is the earnest wish of several thousand residents in northeastern Oregon and southeastern Washington that the Woodward toll road leading over the Blue Mts., which is the only route of travel through the mountains, be eliminated by a continuation of the Columbia Highway to the extreme eastern border of the state, via Pendleton, Weston, Athena, Milton-Freewater, in Umatilla county; Elgin, Imbler, La Grande and Union, of Union county, and on through Baker county by way of Baker. The suggested route is by far the most feasible from the standpoint of construction, will serve the needs of thousands of farmers and townspeople, and would be a big addition in making Oregon a drawing card to tourists. A continued Columbia Highway from the Ida ho line to Astoria would be of untold benefit to all the northern section of the state and in a general way would benefit the state at large.

That the Columbia Highway will eventually extend to the extreme eastern border of the state is not an idle dream and one of the first steps in the preliminaries should be the elimination of the Woodward toll road, which, in its present form, might be of some value in the national museum at Washington, D. C.

All details have been arranged for the coming game of basketball between the high school quintets of Walla Walla and Elgin and will be played in Bader's Hall, Friday evening, February 11th, and an interesting contest is promised. The doors will be opened at 7:30 and the game called promptly at 8:00 o'clock. An admission of 25c will be charged. The Elginites are anxious that a good attendance be extended as the expenses of the Walla Walla quintet must be met as well as other incidentals.

Elgin automobile agencies, of which there are three, report a most encouraging outlook for the coming season and to all appearances the sales of cars during 1916 will far eclipse the number of any previous year.
