on. Now I'm here in bed."

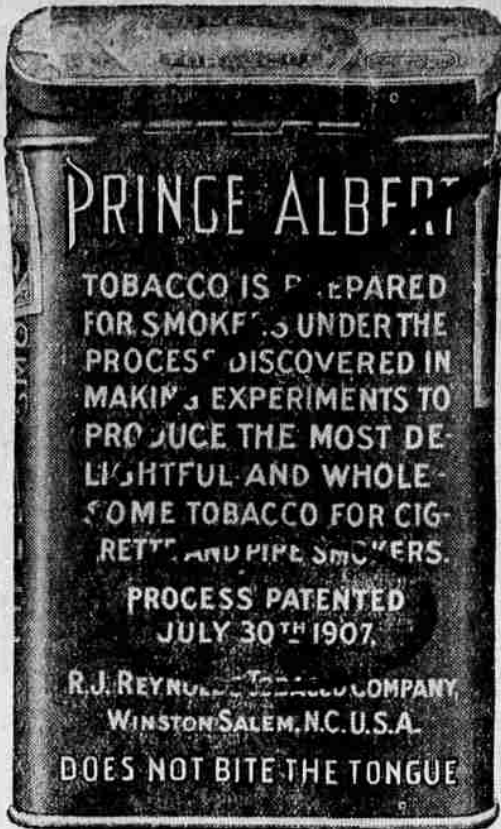
