

ments and proceeding to neutral ports must not be painted with neutral colors or fly a neutral flag. It is recommended that in neutral ports, particularly those of Spain, armament should be concealed as far as possible. A canvas cover is recommended for this purpose.

Many of the ships mentioned among the nineteen instances as having fired on submarines are unidentified, but specific details are given in each instance.


