## SEATTLE TEST ROILS MAYOR

### SCHOOL BOARD DEMANDS SEVERE MENTAL TEST.

Members of Board Angry When Asked to Do Test Themselves.

Seattle, Wash., Feb. 22.—Under an official test given to 12-year-old children in the public schools, most of the officials of Seattle are feeble-minded. Some of them are nearly "imbeciles."

According to the much-discussed Binet test, the ranks of the mentally unsound have been augmented by the following distinguished company: Mayor Gill, two councilmen, the county clerk, Sheriff Bob Hodge, and every member of the board of education, including the secretary.

The Binet test has been widely criticized. Under its provisions hundreds of public school pupils have been declared mentally below par. Two French psychologists invented it. When a pupil's work begins to fall below par, he is put through a mental efficiency test. If he fails, he is then known as deficient. A totally deficient child is sent to the feeble-minded school at Medicine Lake.

Here are two sentences which children, under the test are expected to repeat after hearing them once:

"Saw in the street a pretty little dog. He had curly brown hair, short legs and a long tail."

A 12 year old normal child is supposed to repeat these sentences exactly. When Mayor Gill was asked to repeat the sentence he declined to attempt it.

"I'll bet \$100 not ten per cent of the people in this city can do it correct. I don't believe one per cent could."

All the other officials tried to repeat the sentences. Each one got the words twisted around in some way. Some took it good-naturedly. Others were nettled when they were asked to submit to the test.

Expecting the school director who was out of the city, every member of the Board of Education which adopted the system and keeps it going, failed to repeat two simple sentences after hearing them once.

### WOMEN'S RIGHTS IN KANSAS

If she doesn't like either her own or her husband's family-name, they can change to a name that does please them.

She can wear men's clothing without any restriction except that she must not try to pass herself off as a man.

She can vote at every election.

She can hold any office in the state and run for Congress.

She can hold property in her own right and dispose of her share of the family property by will.

She can take up a homestead or school lands as her own property.
