WARNING TO POOL HALLS

Feeling that unless owners of pool halls and billiard parlors look to their knitting, the public will legislate them out of business ere long, the National Billiard Protective League has sent out circular letters to all patrons of the Balk-Collander tables sounding a note of alarm. La Grande pool hall owners have received them along with all other proprietors in the State.

In the circular, the league, composed of men high in rank of the pool table concern, says, in part:
 Dear Sir:—

It has been brought to the attention of the Association that all billiard rooms in your state are getting into bad repute, by reason of a limited number refusing to comply with local ordinances or neglecting to use good common horse sense in the conduct of their business. Complaints reported to us, are:

- 1—Allowing boys under 18 years of age and undesirable characters to congregate in the billiard room.
- 2—Permitting card playing, on or about the premises.
- 3—Keeping Open after hours.
- 4—Permitting open gambling games, both on the tables and with a dice box on the cigar counter.

The use of the word "Pool Room" has been brought into such bad repute by race horse gambling and book making and bucket shop establishments that the mere mention of it creates a feeling of antagonism with the average parent. Some roomkeepers have changed their signs to "Pocket Billiards" others wholly disregard public opinion and continue to use this objectionable term of "Pool".

Roomkeepers must thoroughly understand that they must keep on good terms with public opinion, if they

want to live. Failing to do so, they will surely go to the wall.

As an indication of what adverse criticism is doing for you at this time we call your attention to the recent decision by Judge Joseph E. Mayer of Des Moines, who recently declared that "The system of the loser paying for a game of carom or pocket billiards is gambling pure and simple." That decision is just a sample of what popular opinion will do in warping the mind of a public official. Give a dog a bad name and he is a bad dog.

We call your attention also to bills introduced in the state legislatures of Oklahoma and Kansas, absolutely prohibiting public billiard rooms in these states.

In six counties of Missouri and over twenty counties of Texas, billiards are absolutely prohibited. We charge this to card playing and blind pig side issues.

Will you assist in a clean-up to put billiards in its rightful place in public opinion? We want you with us, but the first condition of your eligibility is, that of conducting a billiard room that is above reproach.

If the present business depression with its many discouragements has, unfortunately, made you indifferent and careless about conditions in your room, you have our sympathy, and we hope that you will make an effort to improve conditions in the manner which we suggest. A thorough clean-up and the use of a little business tact with those people who are likely to start antagonism for you, will be of assistance in improving the business.

Hoosier Wet and Dry Fight

Indianapolis, Feb. 24.—Gen Barleycorn was marshaling his forces today preparatory to attack and defense at several important points in Indiana in March. April and May will see other important engagements with the anti-liquor crusaders attacking or defending as the case may be. Indiana's liveliest issue, the saloon question, bids fair to retain its acendency for years to come unless the foes of General Barleycorn sweep in from the rural districts and in a statewide movement drive his legions from their hitherto impregnable entrenchments in swamp regions of the big cities. In no other way, say the liquor men, can such cities as Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, Evansville and South Bend be made dry in this generation. Yet 1916 was a winning year for the dry forces, according to figures obtained today from the headquarters of the Anti-Saloon league. In the scores of elections held, the dry forces put out of business 112 saloons. The wets re-established five.

Of Indiana's ninety-two county seats, fifty-four are without saloons. There are thirty-three counties without a wet spot in them. There are 370 dry incorporated towns and thirty-eight dry cities. Elections in 1915, according to the Anti-Saloon league, added territory with 60,000 inhabitants to the dry part of the state. The desperate character of the struggle in Indiana is best indicated by a comparison of the total wet and dry vote for 1915. In twenty-four cities the total vote was: dry 22,021; wet 20,648. Muncie, at present infested with Elinctigeritis, may be the next battleground. Muncie went dry in 1914 by a 482 majority and its Tiger troubles have been displayed to the state ever since that time. Greensburg also will vote in March on the wet and dry issue.

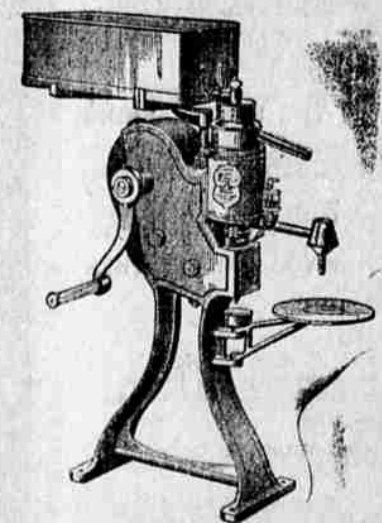
