61,180 Voters Registered. Salem, Or., Feb. 28.—Figures prepared by Secretary of State Olcott show the total registration at the end of last week to have been 61,180. Of this number 40,590 are Republicans; 15,457 are Democrats; 403 Progressives; 1337 are Prohibitionists; 1529 are Socialists and 1864 scattered.

Jefferson Wins Championship. Jefferson, Or., Feb. 28.—Jefferson High school won the debating championship of the North Willamette district by defeating Woodburn and Estacada High schools last Friday evening. The affirmative team of each school traveled. Jefferson won both debates by unanimous decisions. The Jefferson affirmative team composed of Mary Chute, Levant Peace and Carl Booth, defeated Woodburn negative composed of Messrs Dimmick Lawrence and Simms, at Woodburn, by a unanimous decision.

Beaverton's Good Roads Gathering. Beaverton, Or., Feb. 28.—Friday night the Beaverton Chamber of Commerce gave a banquet in Cady hall, at which the guests of honor were Judge Reasoner, Commissioner Madison of the county court, and County Clerk E. C. Luce. The chief speaker of the evening was E. B. Timms of Portland, who addressed those present on the subject of "Organization." J. H. Mulchay, assistant general freight agent of the Southern Pacific company, also addressed the assembly, and several others spoke, all local men, in favor of better highways leading into Portland. Judge Reasoner spoke upon the condition of the county road funds and explained the reason for the lack of needed work between this place and Portland. A banquet was served to 50 visitors and club members.

Naval Gunners' Practice. San Diego, Cal. Feb. 28.—What is declared to be a world's record for accurate and rapid fire gunnery was made by gunners of the armored cruiser San Diego at target practice Friday, it was announced yesterday. The crew of No. 111 six-inch gun

scored eight perfect hits out of eight shots in 72 seconds, firing at a range of 1800 yards. The crew of No. 14 three-inch gun scored the same number of bullseyes in as many attempts in 48 seconds, the range being 1600 yards. Both records were made at night, the pointers picking up the target after it had been illuminated with searchlights.
