## AT THE MOVIES

### AT THE ARCADE.

#### "BATTLE CRY OF PEACE" GRIPPING WAR LESSON.

Pacifists who shout against increasing the army and navy for national defense receive a body blow in "The Battle Cry of Peace," the film spectacle which will be shown at the Arcade Monday and Tuesday. In vivid pictures and through sub-titles those who decry war preparedness are brought face to face with the disaster that might ensue should a powerful foreign nation invade our shores in our present military state.

No attempt has been made by J. Stuart Blackton, author of the play, to deal with his subject with kid gloves. Blunt, unvarnished and grim facts were set forth by Mr. Blackton.

Shows Brutality of War. The author has deviated far from the beaten path in picture drama building. To drive home his message he shows war in all its brutality and grossness, carrying his theme into two peaceful homes which suffer from the invasion of a foreign army. An observer will not find the happy ending prevalent in most picture productions. If he seeks the American soldiers to repel the invading forces at the end of the picture he is doomed to disappointment. The American soldiers do have their in-ning with the enemy, but suffer a disastrous defeat and bow to the enemy, accepting "peace at any price."

At the end of two and a half hours of startling episodes picturing realities and fantasies by double photography attended by an inspiring musical score and suitable "effects," spectators were heard to comment how woefully weak America is. Statistical diagrams of population and wealth compare this country with other nations of importance and show how ridiculously small is the army and navy Uncle Sam provides to safeguard his property.

Thrills Patriotic Citizens. Every patriotic American will be thrilled and inspired by this play, which distinctly is an American production for American people, adapted by an American from Hudson Maxim's book, "Defenseless America." Hyphenated Americans will find nothing offensive in the picture, for the enemy comes from a mythical country. The spy in the play, a distinguished looking foreigner who masquerades as a peace propagandist is called Emanon, which read backward stands for "no name."

### Shows Maximum Speaking.

In the opening scenes Hudson Maxim addresses a gathering on the necessity of preparedness, pointing out how well prepared the belligerent nations in Europe were for the present war and how poorly equipped this country is in every way. Submarines are shown in action and torpedoes are discharged at an imaginary foe. The boom of the cannon from the battleships and the disappearing guns on land, accompanied by appropriate sound from the orchestra are absolutely thrilling.

If some of the grousome scenes in the play appear a bit drawn out, they firmly impress upon the observer the basic motive of the play. The drama is well staged and deftly acted.

Surprises in Photography. Photographically "The Battle Cry of Peace" contains some surprises. Through trick camera work a struggling humanity is seen in the heart of New York fleeing to escape the bombs hurled from the shells of the enemy's battleships.
