census estimates, die every year before they are 12 months old.

Have you noticed the "Saving Light" at the corner of Depot and Adams?

"Every time this light fades, somewhere in Europe or the United States a baby under one year, dies; one every ten seconds; six every minute; 360 every hour. Half of these deaths are preventable"—U. S. Department of Labor, Children's Bureau Bulletin.

"It was formerly believed that the rate of mortality among children who had not reached the first anniversary of their birth was a wise dispensation of nature, intended to prevent children with weak constitutions becoming too plentiful. Today we know that a great infant mortality is a national disaster—on the one hand, because numerous economic values are created without purpose and prematurely destroyed, and on the other, because the cause of the high rate of infant mortality affect the powers of resistance of the other infants and weaken the strength of the nation in its next generation."—Prof. Deitrich.

"The fundamental causes of infantile mortality are mainly the result of three conditions—poverty, ignorance and neglect."—Dr. Emmett Holt.

There are three groups of diseases which together cause about three-fourths of all the deaths among babies. These three groups are:

- 1. Digestive diseases, which cause most of the deaths of babies in summer. Battle-fed babies are most often affected.
- 2. Diseases of the lungs.
- 3. Diseases due to conditions affecting the child before or at birth.

Some of the causes which lead to these are:
