SECOND MIXED-VEGETABLE CAR ARRIVES

La Grande has demonstrated herself to be a great vegetable-consuming community. A couple of weeks ago retailers gasped when a carload of mixed vegetables was brought to La Grande—now another mixed carload lot has come. This guarantees plenty of crisp fresh vegetables for tomorrow's shopping.

Furthermore two carloads of oranges—another record-breaking stunt pulled by the LaGrande Fruit Co.—have been brought to La Grande for March consumption. Also, a carload of bananas came with the lot, making four carload lots brought in by one firm this week.

Adjustment of Interforest Preferences Is Chief Business.

Baker, March 8.—Six Eastern Oregon and Washington National forests and 673,600 head of stock were represented today at a meeting held in the Minam National forest offices in this city, when forest supervisors gathered to adjust inter-forest grazing preferences. Several hundred cases were investigated and adjusted.


