Enterprise, Ore., March 15.—Special—Fred S. Ashley, of this city, prominent rancher and former furniture dealer, has announced positively that he will enter the fight for the primary nomination for representative for the Wallawa-Union county district. Mr. Ashley is considered one of the most active men in Wallawa county, both politically and commercially. He has resided in Enterprise for some time but is thoroughly acquainted all over the county and has a wide acquaintance in Union county.

McCully For Sheriff

It is also reported here that Fred McCully may make the race for the Republican nomination for sheriff. Sometime ago there was a rumor to this effect, but it died down and apparently Sheriff Marvin was to once more have the sheriff's office for another term without opposition. Marvin is a Democrat, but has held the position several terms although Republicans were in a heavy majority in the county.

A move to beat Marvin is on in earnest, according to reports and the Republican support is centering on Fred McCully in an endeavor to force him to permit the use of his name at the primaries, at which time it is predicted he will have no opposition. Following his nomination a strong lineup is in the course of preparation to back McCully in a way that will reclaim Wallawa county from Democracy so far as the sheriff's office goes, and defeat Marvin, who has been sheriff there for several terms.

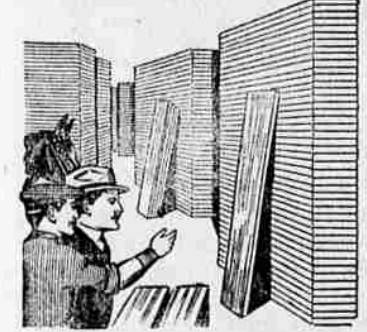
