"Rainmaker" Asks \$4,000 For 4,000,000 Gallons

San Diego, Cal., Feb. 23.—Charles M. Hatfield, the "rainmaker," today made an offer to the San Diego City Council to settle for \$4,000 his \$10,000 claim against the city for "filling" Morena Reservoir. Hatfield said he would do this rather than have the trouble of a lawsuit. His offer was referred to City Attorney Cosgrave.

"I am not here, gentlemen, to demand something that does not belong to me. Should you vote to deny the payment of the \$10,000 I will be forced which is contrary to my own honest inclination, and I sincerely do not wish to do it, to bring suit against San Diego for the recovery of my fee. Your refusal to pay me would imply that I failed to fill Morena. This would damage my reputation, which is not only local but national.

"Of the 10,000,000 gallons of water impounded in Morena during the life of my demonstrations, 4,000,000,000 is my property and remain—so until paid for by you. This 4,000,000,000 gallons of water at \$1,000 per billion gallons equals \$4,000. To relieve your city of all further obligations I am willing to settle with you for this amount, namely, \$4,000, although the expense of my demonstration while at Morena in the way of material, chemicals and a thousand other expenses too numerous to mention would constitute a total of \$3,000.

Feast Recalls Deliverance of Jews of Persia; Date Falls on March 19

This Year.

Purim, a feast in the Jewish calendar, falls this year on March 19. The reading of the Book of Esther from a parchment scroll on that day constitutes the principal feature in the Synagogue service. The feast recalls the deliverance of the Jews of Persia through the intervention of Queen Esther and her kinsman Mordecai

from a threatened massacre planned by Haman, the king's vizier. In the words of the Book of Esther it commemorates "the day wherein the Jews had rest from their enemies and the month which was turned unto them from sorrow to gladness and from mourning unto a good day." It was decreed that the day be observed in a joyous spirit that finds expression in sending portions to one another and gifts to the poor. (Esther Chap. 9, verse 20.)

The feast bears the name of "Purim," because it is recorded that Haman the arch enemy of the Jews, sought to fix the day of their destruction by casting "Purim" which, according to a popular etymology given in the Book of Esther, means "Lots." The feast is more social in character than religious. It does not require cessation from labor or any special religious ceremony other than the reading of the Book of Esther and the reciting of a few special prayers inspired by the event commemorated.

In former times the celebration in some places partook of the nature of a carnival. At present the Story of the Book of Esther is not unfrequently presented in dramatized form. The injunction to remember the poor was and is observed faithfully. During the centuries of persecution, the feast of Purim was quite popular, due, perhaps, to the fact that the story of deliverance from the plottings of the tyrants, which the day recalled, brought hope of a similar deliverance from the evil designs of existing Hamans. Several La Grande Jews observe this historic date rigidly.

Hearings on Complaints by Service Commission.

Salem, Ore., March 15.—Announcement was made today by the public service commission that it had fixed March 29 as the time for hearing an application for a physical connection between the Southern Pacific Railroad company and the Willamette Valley Southern. It will be held at Mount Angel.

Other hearings set by the commission are as follows: March 27, Oregon City, involving side track facilities on the Southern Pacific; April 3, Grants Pass; April 4, Medford, and April 7, Klamath Falls, on complaints relative to the rates of the California-Oregon Power company. At Medford, April 5, a hearing will be held with relation to the rates of the Home Telephone company of Southern Oregon.
