### Husband Torn From Wife's Clinging Arms.

Ellensburg, Wash., March 16.—(P. N. S.)—How Villista bandits tore John Walton Walker of Playas, N. M., from the arms of his wife and shot him, was told here Wednesday by Dr. L. H. Walker, who received a letter giving details of the Columbus massacre. The Walker killed at Columbus was a brother of Dr. Walker, who is an Ellensburg physician. Walker had been married but four weeks and he and his wife were delegates to a Sunday school convention at Columbus. When the Villista bandits entered the Central hotel they compelled Walker to leave his room and "go downstairs to shake hands with the captain." A few minutes later Mrs. Walker heard the shots which killed her husband and the proprietor of the hotel.

The bandits fired the hotel and Mrs. Walker was saved from death in the flames by customs riders who lowered her from an upper window on a rope made of sheets.

Dr. Walker has received a telegram stating that his brother was buried at Playas, where another brother still lives.

### CREAMERY BEING ENLARGED

Old Machinery to Make Room for Modern Equipment

The Dalles, Or., March 15.—The Norman Ice Cream company of this city recently purchased the Mountain Valley Creamery of this city and a force of men is at work enlarging and improving the plant. When all the improvements are installed The Dalles will have one of the finest and most modern creameries and ice cream factories in the state. All old machinery, which was formerly used for making butter and ice cream, has been discarded, and new and modern machinery will be installed.

The Norman Ice Cream company was organized several years ago entirely by local capital. Several thousand dollars will be spent by this company in opening a new plant, which, it is expected, will be ready for operation within a fortnight. In the past the splendid possibilities for making high grade creamery butter from the cream supply of Wasco county have not been taken advantage of, with the exception of the small Mountain Valley creamery.

The new company plans to employ a large force of men, who will work under the direction of expert butter and ice cream makers. The Dalles product will be distributed to all parts of the state.
