MASTER FLOYD WILLIAMS KING OF BABIES

EUGENICS CHAMPIONSHIP QUARTET
 First, Floyd Ray Williams, aged four, 99;
 Tied for second place, Franklin Eberhard, aged four, 99;

Floyd Ray Williams, four year-old son of Mrs. George R. Williams, 1705 1/2 Adams avenue, stands the king of better babies in La Grande following announcement of scores attained in the eugenics contest held here under auspices of the state Federation of Women's clubs and the La Grande Neighborhood club during "Better Babies week." Pressing him hard for supreme and sovereign honors, stand three others, and crowding those

three follow nine others scored 981. The remarkable score of the Williams boy, and the exceptionally high scores of 22 others, compliment the county's baby crop. Out of the 70 measured under direction of Mrs. A. Bayly, Portland club expert, 47 passed a mark of 95 or better. Mrs. A. L. Richardson, chairman of local affairs, who has devoted a tremendous amount of time to the successful contest, feels well repaid for her efforts through the distinction brought to Union county babies. Mrs. Bayly writes her that she is mailing the individual score cards to the various mothers today.

Perusal of the list of "95 or better" babies reflects great credit on the health of the community and the standard of the baby crop. Drawing the honors still finer, the list of 98 or better is indeed unusually large.

Out of large classes competing it is not so unusual to have one or two touch the 99 mark but to have one contestant five tenths of a point from perfect and 22 out of 70 98 or better, must, perforce, be admitted to be a stellar exhibit of babies.

YUAN'S WOES INCREASING

Pekin, Feb. 1.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press.)—By special command of President Yuan Shi-Kai, plans for holding the enthronement ceremonies in February were cancelled and no date is yet set for the President's accession. The reason assigned for the postponement is the disturbance in the province of Yunnan, but the earnestness with which the entente powers advised delay is believed to have been a factor in the decision.

While the postponement saves Yuan Shi-Kai from immediate international complications, it does not improve his domestic problems. In fact, it will doubtless be capitalized heavily by the revolutionists as an indication of his weakness in that he yielded to pressure from Japan and other foreign powers.

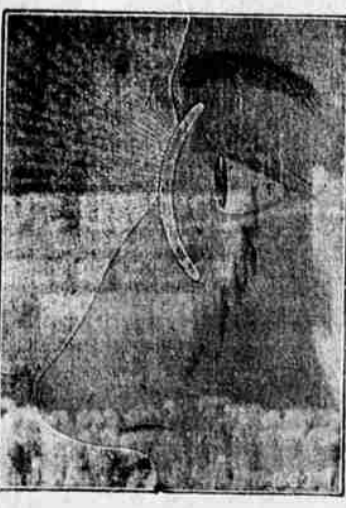
