SMALL TOWNS DO BUILDING

ELGIN AND NORTH POWDER SHOW THRIFT

Big Structures of Modern Type To Be Constructed At Once

The first announcement of the season along the line of new buildings for the year was made Tuesday when R. D. Zweifel purchased the Simonsen lot on Front St. and declared his intention to erect a new brick building thereon at an early date.

The lot is the one on which was located the Elgin Bakery, the building having been destroyed by fire last fall. The location is excellent for business purposes, being located between the brick structure occupied by D. A. Barnes' meat market and the Sommer Hotel brick. The lot is 22 x 72 feet, and the purchase price said to have been in the neighborhood of \$600.

Mr. Zweifel, the purchaser, states that plans will immediately be drawn for a new brick structure, which will be of the same dimensions as the lot. At present he figures on building only one story. Work will be commenced on the same as soon as weather permits and material can be secured.

The building will be occupied by the owner in a line of business to be announced at a later date. Mr. Zweifel was engaged in business for several years, most of the time in the hardware line. When he returned from California last fall it was with the intention of re-engaging in business and since that time has been dickering for a suitable location, with the above results.

The new brick structure will be finished with a modern front and will be a big improvement to that business block. Two buildings, both frame structures, have been destroyed by fire during recent months, leaving an unsightly vacancy mid-way of the block. The City Cigar Store building was the last destroyed and the work of clearing the lot of debris will be started in a few days and it is not unlikely that a brick will be erected thereon in the near future.

Anent the Coming Flower Carnival

Disagreeable weather interfered to no small degree with the meeting of Elgin ladies held Tuesday afternoon to discuss plans for the holding of the annual flower carnival. Several were in attendance and various points of interest relative to the event were discussed and the carnival is now an assured fact.
