Tillamook In Grip of Heavy Storm

Bay City, Or., March 27.—Heavy seas are pounding the beach at Barview again, washing away the shoreline and endangering the Southern Pacific tracks recently rebuilt after the fall storms which practically destroyed Barview and the railroad property there. The railroad company is taking rock from the quarry intended for jetty work and using it in an effort to protect the track. The work went on during all of last night, a large crew of men laboring faithfully in an effort to save the line. The jetty thus far has suffered no damage and is believed to be safe.

The heavy winds and rains of the past three days have put Tillamook county rivers over their banks and have caused much damage on ranches where pastures are under water and are covered with muck. Telephone and telegraph lines are down and the service is demoralized in every direction. The train service between this section and Portland is badly demoralized, rock slides covering the tracks in many places, while fallen trees and slides have interrupted traffic on the county roads.

Placer Mining Will Be Resumed Sumpter, Or., March 27.—Extensive arrangements are being made for the resumption of placer work in the many districts of this section. Eli Bair and Edwin Young are at work on Gimlet Creek. Mayor W. C. Common and Ralph Hatley, of this city, are preparing to start work immediately on the old Dickson placers in the Granite district. Other properties in this same section will be mined, as a good flow of water is now on, insuring a long run for the season. On Pine Creek, in the Burnt River country, much placer mining will be done. On Cracker Creek, above Sumpter, a great deal of prospecting was carried on last season with the result that several parties will work along gravel beds this summer.

Experiment Station for Mines Urged Washington, March 28.—Representative Sinnott is urging the director of the bureau of mines to establish a mining experiment station at Baker. In support of his request he has submitted statistics, furnished him by local mining men, showing that in Baker county are found 40 of the 89 minerals reported as existing in the state of Oregon. The county produces six out of the eight precious metals found in the state, and has more gold placer mines than any other Oregon county.
