Seattle To Ship Cotton

Seattle, Wash., March 30.—To care for an enormous shipment of cotton which is to be routed through Seattle to the Orient, the Seattle port commission yesterday authorized the immediate construction of a new warehouse at the Smith cove terminals. The commission has been notified that 50,000 tons of cotton from the South will be shipped through here during the next few months. Because of the scarcity of ocean tonnage additional warehouse facilities are needed.
