AUTOMOBILE NEWS.

Ten Dodges, making in all two carloads, are scheduled to be unloaded by Distributor L. C. Smith today. This shipment is already sold and deliveries will begin as soon as the machines are unloaded. The shipment does not fill the orders already sold.

At the start of the present automobile selling season which began, with most companies, in the middle of last summer, several plans were adopted to give better service to the automobile owner, recites C. Wilson, local agent for the Hupmobile. He says: "The Hupp Motor Car Corporation started out with its Series 'N' Hupmobiles with a definite guaranteed service system which it has now maintained for ten months and has met

with uniform success in all parts of the country. The Hupmobile Nationwide service plan has probably been the greatest innovation which that live concern has made in several seasons. These service stations are being increased every week. The corporation started out with a thousand stations in the early summer and has steadily increased until the number is now over 3500 and a campaign is on to make this 6000 by May 1st. Willys-Overland officials wired John North Willys, president of that company, who is en route to California, that on Monday the factory passed the hundred thousandth car of the 1916 models.

This big record of a tenth of a million cars stands without a precedent in the manufacture of cars of this size and type.

It was only in 1908 that Mr. Willys, as head of the Willys-Overland company, celebrated the production of 400 cars a year as the conclusion of a successful year's business.

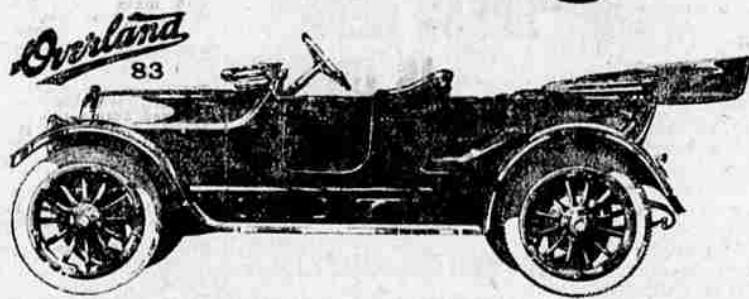

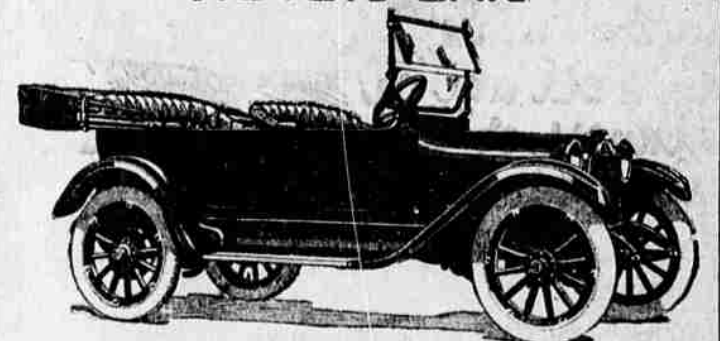
