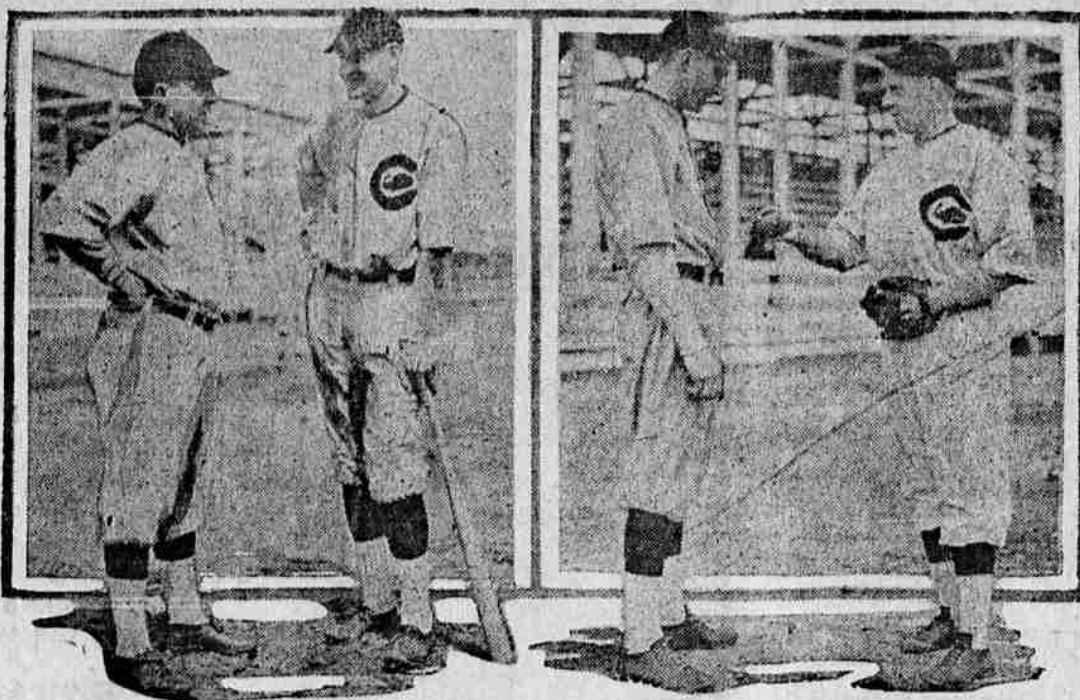
The big card of the evening will be that between Fulp of Cove, about 151, and Lottes, about 144 1-2. Just who the other La Grande wrestlers are will be determined later.

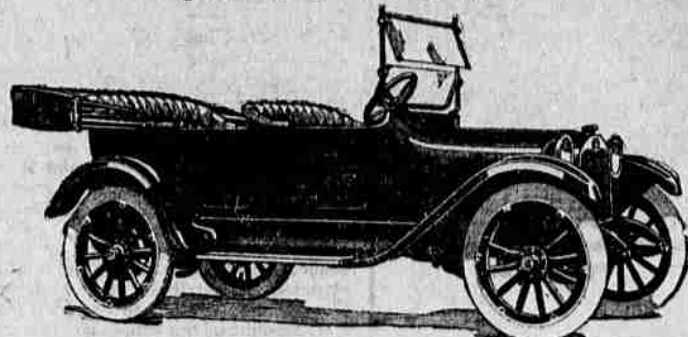

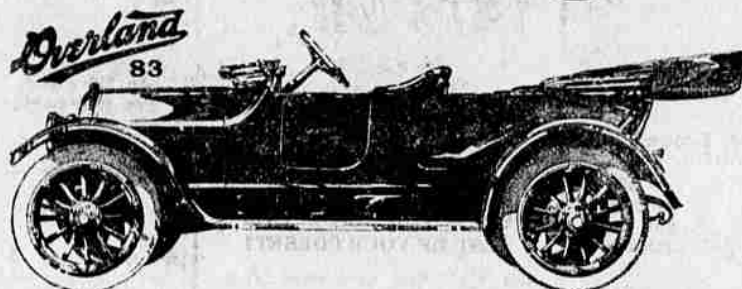
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
