PAULINE FREDERICK EXCEEDS HERSELF.

Gives Great Characterizations in Famous Players "The Spider."

So great is the sincerity and the power which Miss Frederick puts into her acting, and so lasting is the spell of her own imagination upon the start that, when she worked herself up to the psychological point at which she portrays the cynical, heart-sore woman of the world, it is hours before she can assume the happy, light-hearted ingenueness of the younger and less sophisticated girl.

Conversely, if she is playing Joan, the girl, she cannot instantly change to Valerie, the woman. So it was that when she read the script of "The Spider," Miss Frederick declared that she could do her best work if she were permitted to concentrate upon first the one character and then the other, and since the two never meet upon the screen the suggestion was easily agreed to by her director.

There is little doubt that the wisdom of the director in making this concession to Miss Frederick will be apparent at once to everyone who sees this Paramount Picture at the Arcade.

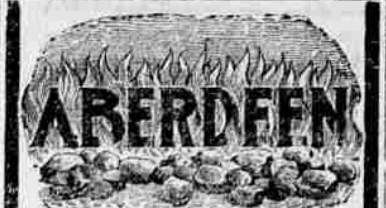

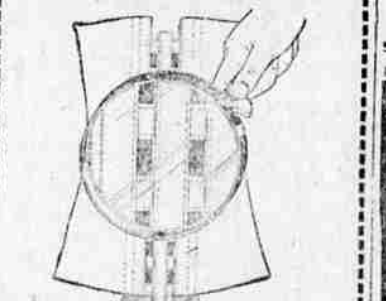
