Fish farming in small inland ponds—natural and artificial is a suggestion of the United States Commissioner of Fisheries, and he offers young fish for stocking such ponds, together with instructions and advice. This plan, it is believed, should bring thousands of waste spots into service for reducing the cost of living.

Natural ponds, swamps and unproductive marshy meadows are common, and with a small outlay of labor and capital these can be converted into suitable basins for fishes. These would give farmers the additional advantage of storing water for irrigation in times of drought.

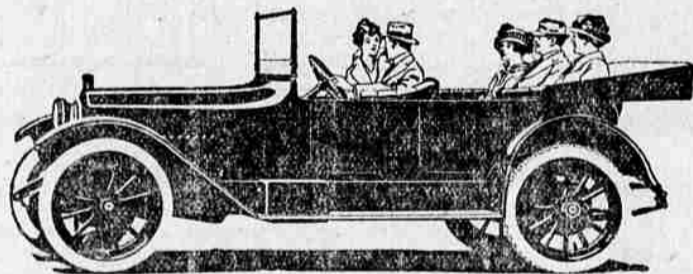
