

MAGPIE TEST WINNERS OUT

BEN BUESING SCORES HIGHEST
IN 1915.

Award of Prizes Means Beginning of
Additional Campaigns.

Winners of the 1915 magpie and crow campaign conducted by the Wing, Fin & Fleetfoot club have been determined, and at the same time the club has inaugurated a 1916 destruction of these carnivorous birds. Ben Buesing carries off first prize. The total list of birds slain during 1915 by members of the sportsmen's club of which record is kept reaches 507, divided 79 crows and 429 magpies. The list of awards made to date include:

First prize—(Automatic shell vest presented by W. H. Bohnenkamp & Co.) Ben Buesing with 180 birds.
Second prize—(Dickinson hunting knife and sheath presented by F. L. Lilly, hardware) T. L. Fisher with 104 birds.
Third prize—(Seventy-five Win-

chester shotgun shells, 12-gauge, presented by the Golden Rule) Harry Becker with 94 birds.

Fourth prize—(Five hundred .22 shells—shorts—presented by T. L. Fisher, novelty store) Ed Meyersick with 86 birds.

Fifth prize—(Franco electric flash light presented by Bert Hughes, sporting goods house) Nate Zweifel with 39 birds.

Special prize—(One box of cigars for magpie with longest beak presented by P. A. Foley) Ben Buesing. Beak measured 2 3/16th inches.

Now that the 1915 campaign has been so successfully carried out, and so many carnivorous birds have been slain, and the winners have their prizes, the club directors are turning their attention to the present season which will include another contest for magpies and crows. But they have other things on their minds.

For instance, they have decided that the annual election of directors shall be held at the date of the annual club fish feed which will occur some time in July this year. This is to get as big a delegation out as possible.

Many believe, or think they believe, that the annual fee connected with membership in this club, is for providing two big feeds a year. As a matter of fact the feeds are secondary matters. Last year the club had a carload of small trout fry—little tiny fellows—brought to La Grande and here were transplanted, as it were, to a special pond where they were fed and nurtured until they attained greater size. They were then taken out to the main streams and permanently "planted." All this cost money. The club hired teams to haul a carload of bass to Morgan Lake. Now if it wasn't for the club directing and meeting these expenses, how would the bass get there? Therefore every person who has enjoyed, or intends to enjoy, the keen sport of hauling bass out of Morgan Lake should pay the \$1.00 to help others help it. Which leads to the remark that if the club has these various dollars early, instead of late in the year—not the night of the fish feed, but now—it could do a lot more work than it does do, for naturally enough the club will not undertake more than it has money to accomplish.

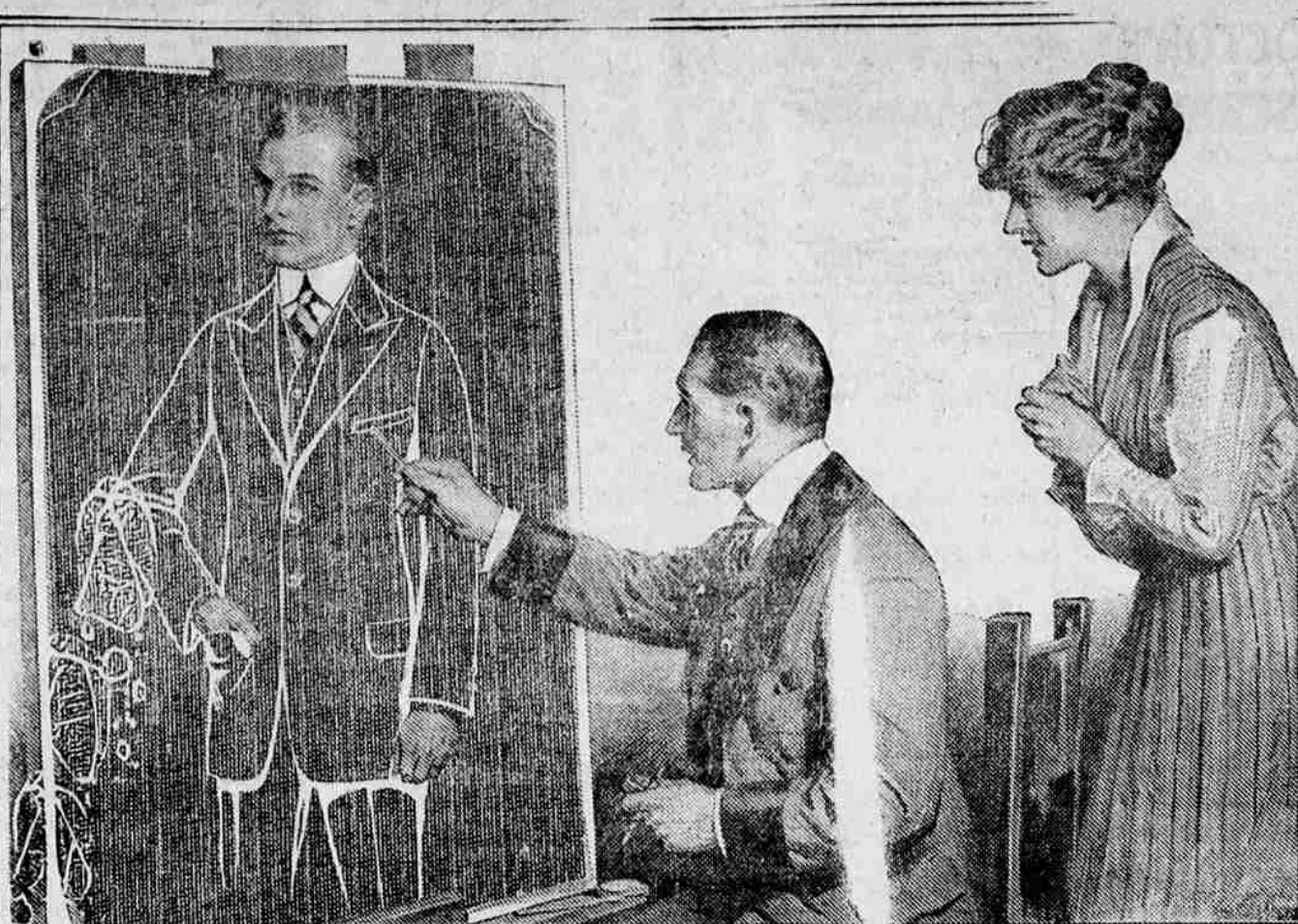

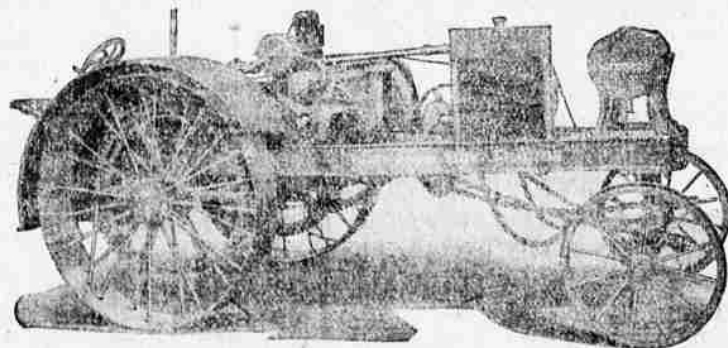
