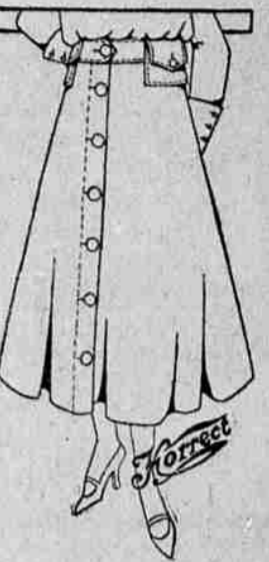

Illinois and Texas Women have Front Seats

Chicago, April 20.—When thirty thousand women from the United States and other nations meet in New York from May 22 to June 2 for the twenty-first bi-ennial meeting of General Federation of Women's clubs, the question, "Do Illinois ladies hear?" will by no means have the same significance as it did two years ago in Chicago when Illinois ladies were hostesses and sat high up in the gallery of the auditorium almost beyond ear shot of the speakers. This year the three hundred delegates from Illinois and the delegates from Texas are to be given front seats in the Seventh Regiment Armory, Park Avenue, New York. Illinois is so honored because her delegates took back position two years ago and because Mrs. Frances D. Everett, who has arranged the program, is an Illinois woman. Texas is given right of way because Mrs. Percy V. Pennybacker,

Texas, is general federation president. Not only this, but the delegations from Texas and Illinois will make their headquarters at the Hotel Astor, also the convention's headquarters. Illinois will announce at the New York confederation that her members have given nearly a tenth of the \$100,000 Sarah Platt Decker memorial fund started four years ago. This sum is nearly three thousand dollars more than Illinois was expected to give. The Illinois delegation, three hundred strong, will leave Chicago for New York in a special train over the Michigan Central railroad. The train will leave Chicago Sunday afternoon, May 21.

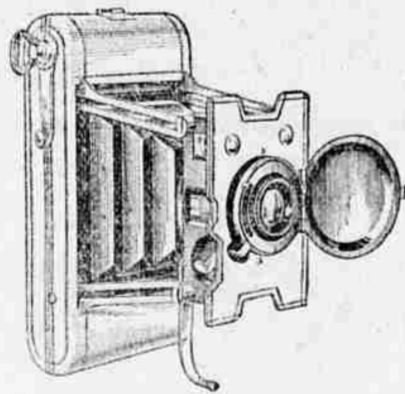

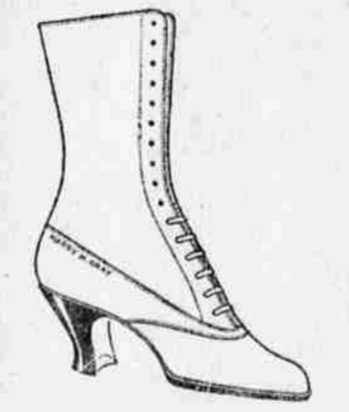
