Fifteen-cent strawberries "have come." Joy prevails in many households where the commissary chiefs balk at paying 20 cents for who wouldn't contribute 15 cents for a box of good strawberries. The quality is, if anything, better than last week's offers at 20 cents per box.

At the same time that strawberries were coming down fresh tomatoes dropped five cents a pound and new cabbage assumed a higher level.
