of this. Make the home a real home with the things to make it attractive. Spend some time on your home, on your lawn and with your flowers. Educate your young people in agriculture, in domestic science and domestic art and keep them at home. When we need agricultural men educated for the purpose, get an Oregon boy, educated in Oregon. Prepare him for the job instead of getting an outsider. Follow these rules and in this beautiful land of Oregon for Oregonians will all be happy and prosperous. With the wonderful natural resources, our mountains that exceed Switzerland in beauty, beautiful homes and our young people interested in better farming and better livestock, we can make it the best place on earth.

The governor was greeted with prolonged applause after his short but excellent address, and without doubt his words were an inspiration toward the attainment of better things for the farm, home and family. He was followed by President W. L. Thompson of the American National bank of Pendleton, who spoke on the subject of "The Cow, the Horse and the Bank." Mr. Thompson referred to the closeness of the relations between the bankers and stockmen of Eastern Oregon, closer here probably than in many sections of the country. He touched on the rural credits question, favoring the national plan rather than have the state take an active part. He spoke of the changing status of commercial paper and the fact that farm loans are considered largely in this class at the present time. He urged borrowers to make confidants of their bankers, tell them their exact situation, to the end that the confidence would justify loans that otherwise might not be granted. "Your banker can do more for you if he knows your exact condition," said Mr. Thompson. He urged a higher standard of stock breeding, especially of horses, in replenishing the supply somewhat depleted by the European war. He praised the stockmen's organization and the idea of the bankers meeting with them. "It is a most successful meeting," he said in closing, "and more meetings of this sort will do much toward further cementing the relations between the bankers and stockmen." Numerous resolutions were adopted by the convention, the most important in brief being as follows: That support be given financially and otherwise to the marketing committee of the national association in efforts to stop price manipulations; That the Oregon Agricultural College be requested to make a survey and investigation of the cost of growing livestock in Oregon and report to the executive committee; That a shipper of animals bearing brands other than his own, secure a certificate with his bill of sale; That a law be passed requiring railroads to get certificates before shipping stock; That sufficient deputy inspectors be employed to safeguard shippers; That the brand inspector al-
