Joseph Barton Badly Injured.

Baker, May 3.—Joseph Barton, one of the best known pioneer residents of Baker and former general manager of the Sumpter Valley railroad, was painfully injured at his home in South Baker yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Barton was working on a gasoline engine used to operate a pump for domestic purposes at his home and had his left arm near the fly-wheel when the engine either back-fired or started unexpectedly from the battery on which Mr. Barton had been working. Mr. Barton's arm was badly broken between the wrist and elbow, one of the bones being badly shattered. He also suffered some cuts about the head.

He was taken at once to the office of his son, Dr. C. E. Barton, where he was given attention, and later to the hospital, where he was cared for further. The injury is a very serious one and a great shock to a man of Mr. Barton's age.

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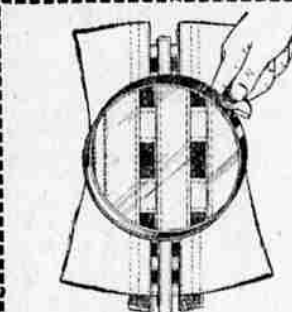
