Big Salmon Caught

Roseburg, Ore., May 2.—Chinook salmon have proved a royal sport here for a week, big catches having been made in the North Umpqua river. The largest fish caught with a spoon weighed 46 pounds. This was taken at the forks of the North Umpqua and South Umpqua. Fishermen at Winchester have received 15 cents a pound for every Chinook they could catch, and cannot satisfy the demand.

NEW LAND DECLARED MYTH.

MacMillan Polar Expedition Sends Denial of Peary Discovery.

New York, May 2.—A letter dated Etah Greenland, November 28, 1914, from Donald B. MacMillan, leader of the Crocker Land expedition, to Colonel H. D. Borup, U. S. A., retired, father of the late George Borup, who was to have led the expedition, recites the discovery that Crocker Land, as Peary thought he saw it, does not exist, and that the expedition is equipped with food to last until August, 1915—seven months ago.

Mr. MacMillan added that if the relief ship Cluett failed to reach them by that time the party would be compelled to live as do the Eskimos. Recent advices say that the Cluett failed to reach Etah last summer, but her crew intended to attempt to send

sledges to Etah to bring Mac Millan and his men back to the ship at North Star Bay, 125 miles south.
