City Manager's Report.

General manager's report for the week ending May 6, 1916.
To the Commission:—There were no fires last week. Found some short circuits on the fire alarm line, and cleared the line. Mr. Plympton representing A. C. Long inspected the auto truck and declared it in first class condition.
The water superintendent spent \$34.50 on two taps and repair work, and \$100.00 digging ditch and laying 4 inch pipe. From Birch to Ash was 365 feet, from Ash to Fourth was 493 feet and from Fourth to Division was 362 feet. This work was finished this week.

The police arrested one on a state charge and one for speeding. They had no sleepers.

The street superintendent spent \$16.75 to finish grading Y avenue; \$84.31 for teams and \$44.87 for extra help cleaning up rubbish and hauling it to the dump. A total of 91 large loads were hauled. He spent \$7.12 flushing; \$4.87 repairing cross walks; \$4.75 for sweeping; \$7.80 for cleaning streets and \$15.00 for White wing, and \$12.00 for man at the dump.

The recorder received \$20.00 pound fees; \$16.69 principal and \$4.00 interest on sewer two section one; \$1.50 for three building permits and \$15.00 for dog license. He issued a theatre license on treasurer's receipt for \$25 and electrical license for \$20.00. He issued library warrant for \$116.30 on vouchers 353 to 357, a park warrant for \$50.00 on voucher 63; salary warrants for \$1313.67 and labor warrants for \$884.79.

The treasurer received \$682.25 water rent; \$355.22 Imp. Dist. Installments; \$156.05 Imp. Dist. interest; \$25 theatre license; \$20 electrical license and \$1.00 for two electrical permits. He paid \$462.00 water warrants; \$593.02 road warrants; \$50 park warrants; \$116.30 library warrants; \$72.27 general warrants with

\$7.84 interest on same. He paid \$234.84 Imp. Dist. interest and \$1000 semi-annual interest on \$40,000 sewer bonds.
