Surveying Crews at Work. Albany, Ore., May 13.—Much speculation and interest centers around the presence of two surveying crews in the district east of Detroit and Mill City, working toward Minto Pass in the Cascade mountains. One crew is working along the old grade of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, and another out of Salem, through Stayton and in the same general direction as the former. Five thousand pounds of provisions were shipped to Detroit recently for one of the outfits.

**A FEW ANIMAL DON'TS**

- Don't be inhuman in treatment of animals.
- Don't whip a balking horse.
- Don't work or ride a horse with ill-fitting or unsuitable harness or saddle.
- Don't use animals with sore shoulders and back unless they can be protected against further injury.
- Don't work lame or sick animals to keep them from getting stiff; turn them into pasture or paddock and allow voluntary exercise. Forced exercise will nearly always do harm.
- Don't work a soft horse like you would a well hardened one. Season him gradually.
- Don't put a young animal at hard work too soon.
- Don't start off in a hurry; warm up gradually.
- Don't overload and don't overwork.—North Carolina Experiment Station.
