She has been tied to a post, where the flowing lava will destroy her, because the natives believe that by this sacrifice they will appease the wrath of the divinity of the mountain. Mack takes the fainting girl to a place of safety and on her recovery she falls down before him, as she thinks he is the son of the god of the mountain which is in eruption. He soon tires of the idyl-like life and re-

turns to civilization. As he is passing a restaurant he hears the song of "Aloha Oe" (Farewell), and is so homesick for the life he had left among the palms and flowers that he ships back to the island.
