#### AT ARCADE

**Marie Doro Again Triumphant.**  
Marie Doro, whose motion picture debut in the Famous Players production "The Morals of Marcus," and subsequent appearance in the same company's "The White Pearl," stamped her as one of the most winsome and altogether charming actresses on the screen, will shortly be seen in the Famous Players-Charles Frohman adaptation of the celebrated Sardou drama "Diplomacy," which will be the Paramount picture at the Arcade tonight and tomorrow.  
This is by no means the first time that Marie Doro has played in "Diplomacy," as she was co-star with William Gillette and Blanche Bates in the stage version of the play at the Empire Theatre, New York, last year. At that time she was declared by the New York critics to be the real star of the production, as her work in the role of Dora—the same one which she plays in the motion picture—was the most finished and most delightful of all. One of them expressed it as follows: "It is Marie Doro who is the star of all stars in the play. She is not only an actress of rare charm, equal alike to light

comedy and tense situations, but she is unusually beautiful. In the scene in which her husband makes it known that she is suspected of being a spy, of having betrayed Count Oeloff and of having stolen the precious documents, she is the central figure and carries the entire burden of the action and character portrayal."  
In support of Miss Doro there appear such distinguished players as Elliott Dexter, Edith Campbell Walker, Russell Bassett, Frank Losee and George Majeroni.  
"The Ne'er-Do-Well."  
"The Ne'er-Do-Well," by Rex Beach, the Selig spectacular drama filmed by the Selig Polyscope company, features Wheeler Oakman and Kathlyn Williams and an all-star cast. The hero is Kirk Anthony, a college graduate, a veteran football player, and, since graduation the coach of his university team. Anthony, is strongly engrossing and varied by many richly humorous episodes. Chiquita is by far the most charming feminine character Rex Beach has drawn, and Kathlyn Williams as Edith Cortland is an exceedingly convincing and fascinating type. "The Ne'er-Do-Well" will be shown on Sunday and Monday at the Arcade theatre.
