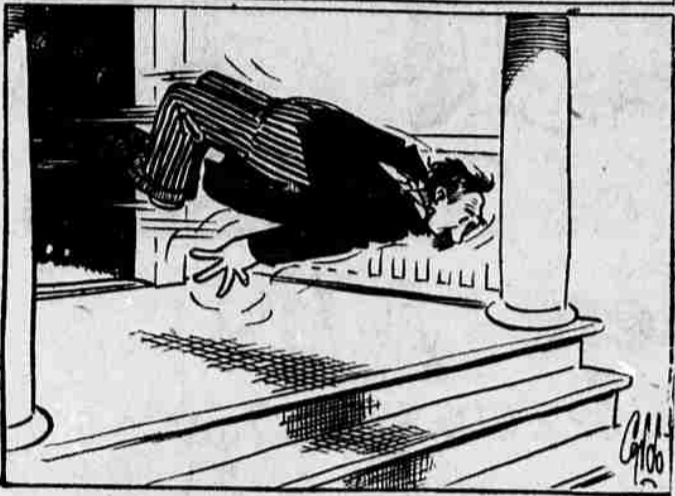
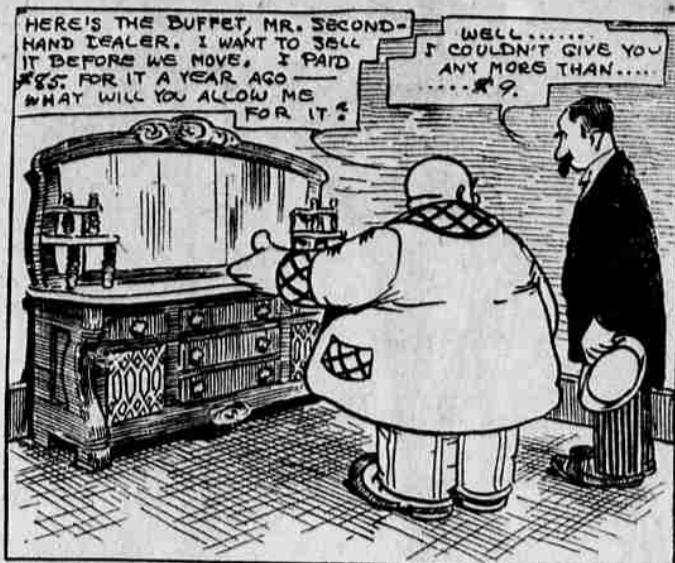

JOSEPH MINE PUT ON BOND

DON CARLOS WILL BE DEVELOPED.

Joseph Much Elated Over Prospect of Brisk Mining.

The most important mining deal ever pulled off in Wallowa county has been completed by F. D. McCully, who has just returned from Denver, where he was successful in negotiating the bonding of the Don Carlos mine to a group of Colorado capitalists.

The Don Carlos, formerly owned by Ralph (Jumbo) Lapham, is one of the richest lead and zinc mines in the United States and lies about five miles southwest of Joseph on Hurricane creek.

The deal is of great importance to the mining industry of this part of the state, for it means that the property will be handled and developed by experienced mining men upon a business basis. The new owners are not promoters, but are actual mining men who have extensive properties in Colorado and thoroughly understand the business in which they are engaged. They have faith in the new undertaking and will push it as rapidly as possible.

The Don Carlos mine gives unusual promise of becoming one of the biggest producers of its kind in the entire country. The showing that has been made thus far has warranted the expenditure of a large amount of money on the property and the new owners are confident that they have one of the best mines that could be obtained. They are not speculators, but are putting their own money into the deal and are counting on handsome returns on the investment.

The war has caused the price of metals to soar to unusual heights, and lead and zinc are among those to go sky-rocketing. There is a strong demand for such metals and the new owners believe they have an investment that will bring them big returns. Active work will begin on the Don Carlos about July 1st.

A Fire Scare.
Saturday night Joe Hamblton's fine new residence on Barton Heights narrowly escaped destruction by fire. Joe was at his garage and when Mrs. Hamblton and children returned home about midnight from the dance they discovered the house on fire. The alarm was given and a crowd of men quickly gathered and extinguished the flames, but not before considerable damage was done. It is thought the fire originated by hot ashes falling through a crack in the stove.

About 7 o'clock last evening fire again broke out in the same house and it required the hardest kind of work this time to save the building. There is no doubt that fire had been smoldering ever since Saturday night between the floors or walls, where no air could reach it.

City Manager's Report.
General Manager's report for the week ending May 13th, 1916.

To the Commission:—The fire department responded to a call to locate the cause of smoke in the M. & M. building on Jefferson avenue. Twelve volunteers out.

The street superintendent spent \$91.75 for men and teams grading east V and east Y avenue, three blocks on Eighth and five blocks on M avenue. He also constructed three cross walks, one on East Adams, one on East Washington and one on Third and Y. White work cost \$15.00; repairs; 40c and cross walk lumber \$12.65.

The police arrested three and the fines amounted to \$20.00.

The water superintendent spent \$2.75 repairing the phone line to Beaver creek; \$7.50 on laying four inch line on Division; \$2.85 on shut off work; \$3.50 cleaning out the sewer from Elm to Hemlock between Washington and Adams; \$5.85 putting in two taps and \$118.40 laying four inch
