THE WHITMAN FOREST CLASSIFIED

DEPARTMENT CLASSIFIES ENTIRE DISTRICT.

Scattering Tracts Left Out Because of Homestead Value.

Announcement is made by the District Forester, George H. Cecil, Portland, Oregon, of the classification, by the Secretary of Agriculture, of practically all the lands within the boundaries of the Whitman National Forest in north eastern Oregon. A net area of approximately 879,218 acres is embraced in this classification, and a small area of 2,742 acres is left for examination later.

The Whitman National Forest lies in the Blue Mountain region of northeastern Oregon, and, according to the report, consists mainly of a large compact body of positive forest land. The report shows that there is a stand of about four billion feet of valuable commercial timber within the Forest, fifty per cent of which is western yellow pine. There is also a considerable stand of young timber and inferior species which has a high value for watershed protection for the streams which are used for irrigation outside the National Forest.

This Forest, it is said, has little agricultural value, and isolated, scattered tracts only could be used for farm purposes. The soil, although fertile, is rocky and shallow, and although records are meager, the rainfall is known to vary from 10 to 40 inches, the snowfall from 20 inches to 30 feet—in the higher altitudes the snow comes as late as mid-June or as early as the last of August; and killing frosts occur every month in the year. The temperature is also known to vary from 30 degrees F below to 120 degrees F above. Practically the entire Forest is at elevations from 4,000 to 10,000 feet. The topography is rough, characterized by deep, precipitous canyons, and jagged peaks. Although over 70,000 acres of alienated land exist within the Forest boundaries, taken up under the Homestead and the Timber and Stone Acts, it is claimed that most attempts at agriculture have proven failures, and a large per cent of the private lands either been abandoned or are being held for their timber and grazing value.

In view, therefore, of these circumstances, and with the exception of small isolated tracts, aggregating 2,742 acres, left for later examination, the Secretary has classified the entire area of the Whitman National Forest as chiefly valuable for forest purposes and not suited to agriculture or livestock under the Act of June 11, 1906.

Defendants in Fraud Case Pardoned.

San Francisco, May 29.—A sensation was sprung in the trial of the so-called Oregon & California railroad land fraud cases in the United States district court here yesterday, when United States Attorney Clarence L. Reames, of Oregon, announced that President Wilson had pardoned John W. Logan, John Cogburn, Fred Bratner and Daniel J. Connor, convicted in the Oregon land fraud cases. They were pardoned, it was announced, so they could appear as principal witnesses against the defendants now on trial, and the announcement of their pardon was made when the attorney for the defendants was endeavoring to have the court note the conviction of the quartet so as to disqualify them as witnesses.

Crew of Convicts At Work

Salem, Or., May 26.—Crews composed of convicts and inmates of the asylum are engaged in making extensive improvements at the State Fair grounds, and when the 55th annual fair opens on September 25, the grounds and buildings will be in the best condition in the history of the fair.

Immediately after his election as secretary of the State Fair board, A. H. Lea began making plans for im-

provements, and much progress has already been made. Under the supervision of Dr. R. E. L. Steiner, superintendent of the asylum, who is in charge of the landscape gardening the lawn of four acres, situated in the inner court, has been spaded and sown to grass. The flower beds have been completely rearranged, and the court between the machinery hall and the new pavilion is being converted into a lawn with a huge flower bed in the center. When this work is com-

plete the grounds will present a most artistic appearance.

Next week a crew will be put to work grubbing out unsightly trees and brush. Much work has been done in whipping the driveways and walks into shape. Secretary Lea has also 25 acres of flax planted, and it is pronounced one of the finest fields in the valley. He has also had sown 30 acre of oats, and he expects a large yield from it.
