TAFT ASKS CLERGY TO AID PEACE

New York, May 20.—The war in Europe has challenged the moral ingenuity of the world, says former President Taft in an appeal to 10,000 ministers of all denominations throughout the country to make plain in next Sunday's sermons the purposes of the League to Enforce Peace, which he heads. It is to open its first national assemblage on May 28 in Washington. "For years," adds Mr. Taft, "we have preached the ideals of peace and have hurled indictments against war. While the world was at peace it was easy to feel that we had done our duty and discharged our responsibility when we had lifted our voice against war in the pulpit, in university

and in the market place. "A long period of peace had lulled the world into a false security. We did not feel a driving urgency about our work for international peace. We were going along quietly, doing what we could to educate public opinion against war, but we did not feel an immediate responsibility for devising organization that would make war less probable. "Then there burst upon the world, over night, the most brutal, the most ruthless, and the most gigantic war of history. The flower of human brotherhood that the Christian forces of the world has been watering and nurturing for centuries was withered by

the hot breath of hate. The results of years of struggle for social justice, for democracy and for larger opportunity for the common man were thrown on a scrap heap and all the energies of mind and heart were unharnessed to the machinery of war." This vast conflict, Mr. Taft says, has shown that substitution of law for war among nations is now the most urgent, the most fundamentally religious duty on earth. "The United States is today," he goes on, "in exactly the position of a man of peace in a frontier town. It is our duty to suggest and stand ready to join an international vigilance committee in which the nations of the world shall join in saying that they will use their combined power, if necessary, to force any nation with a grievance to submit its difficulty to an international court of conciliation before declaring war. "It is doubtful whether the nations will agree to submit to the enforcement of the decisions of such a court. It is practically certain that the nations will not disarm for years to come. Shall we not, therefore, take the one step that is possible? Shall we not say that if nations must arm the armaments shall be used to support law rather than to break it?"

Joined with Mr. Taft in the appeal are Bishop L. T. Wilson of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Shailer Mathews, President of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America; Hamilton Holt and others.

BABY BEGINS LIFE IN DEATH Quick Operation Saves Unborn Child From Mother Killed In Fall

New York, May 10.—For baby Bucchera, one day old, the order of things was reversed and the great adventure came at birth rather than at death. Medical science literally brought life out of death with the arrival of the infant, who is as healthy an inmate of the Long Island College Hospital as could hope to remain in an institution for the sick.

Mrs. Mary Bucchera, mother of the latest claimant to that name, was seated in the window of her flat on the second floor. The window overlooked a narrow airshaft and it was necessary to lean over the sill in order to breathe the occasional Spring winds that found their way in.

Mrs. Bucchera who was holding her 18-months-old daughter, Mary, in her arms suddenly lost her balance. Her mother instinct went out to the child in her arms. She drew it close to her body, and through the manner of its fall probably saved its life.

Baby, Mary, softly crying, still was clasped in her mother's arms when Dr. James Rink lifted the lifeless body of Mrs. Bucchera from the ground. After a hasty examination of the injuries of the mother, he decided that he could save the other child. An operation was performed in the semi-darkness of the

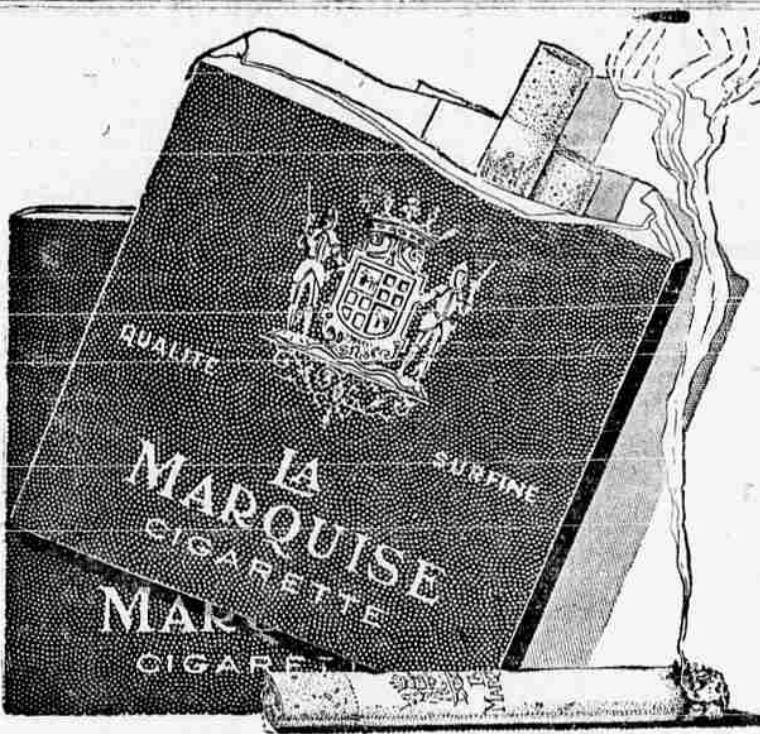
