NEW Y. M. C. A. SECRETARY ORIGINATES SCHEDULE.

Lighter Forms of Exercise Will Prevail During Summer.

A tentative athletic and gymnastic organization was perfected among the juniors of the Y. M. C. A. during the class yesterday. This organization will continue until the more aggressive program will be carried out during the fall and winter months. The object of this form of procedure is to make the summer term interesting as well as beneficial. Lighter exercises will be given and games will predominate. This method of procedure is known as the Group Game system and is very largely competitive. 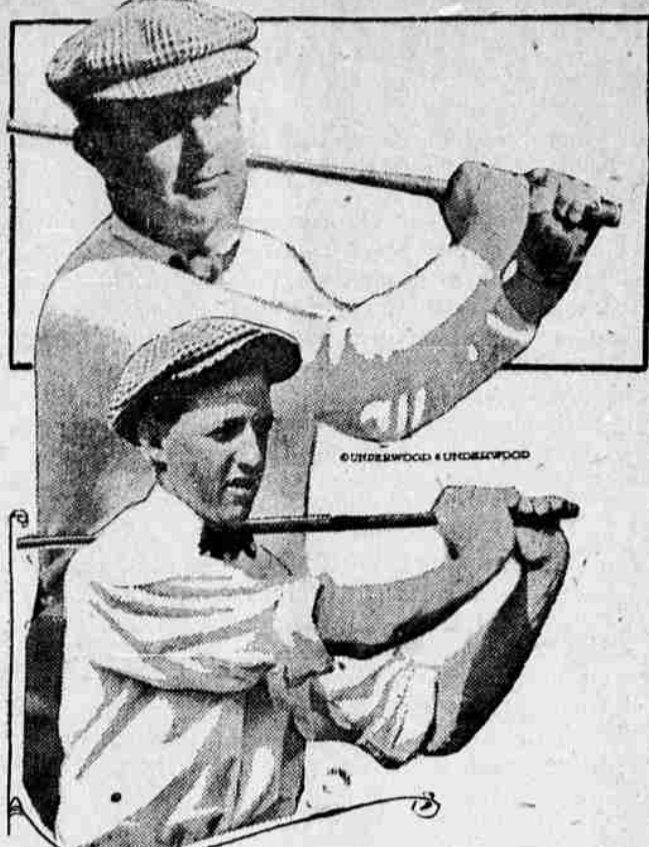
