UNCLE SAM'S FAMILY GROWS

NUMEROUS RESIDENTS TAKEN
INTO CITIZENSHIP.

Patriotic Question Put Before Each
Applicant.

Uncle Sam has six more subjects as
the consequence of an impressive pro
ceeding at the court house today when
a group of citizens, many of whom
have lived in La Grande for almost a
life time, were admitted as citizens.
Until the full citizenship law passed
they had the right of vote but since
then have been denied it, and that law
was largely responsible for bringing
several well known businessmen into
full citizenship today. A list of stipu
lated questions was asked concerning
non-allegiance of anarchy, assassin
gangs, and other law-violating organ
izations or bodies. Witnesses told of
the good character and general ac
tivities of the applicants for citizen
ship during a period of years.

The flag which was recently pre
sented to the court here with inspir
ing ceremonies by Daughters of the
Revolution was used when County
Clerk Ed Wright administered the
final oath of allegiance to the United
States to each.

noon.
