TREES SET BY MACHINE.

Fifteen Thousand Seedlings Daily Is Capacity of Device.

Washington, June 14.—A machine which plants from 10,000 to 15,000 forest tree seedlings a day is now being used at the Letchworth Park Forest and Arboretum in Wyoming County, N. Y., according to officials of the Forest Service who are acting as advisers in the work. Previously the planting has been done by hand at the rate of 1200 to 1500 trees each day per man.

The machine was designed to set out cabbage and tomato plants, but works equally well with trees. It is about the size of an ordinary mowing

machine and is operated by three men and two horses. One man drives the team while the other two handle the seedlings. The machine makes a furrow in which the trees are set at any desired distance, and an automatic device indicates where they should be dropped. Two metal-tired wheels push and roll the dirt firmly down around the roots. This is a very desirable feature, it is said, because the trees are apt to die if this is not well done. Two attachments make it possible to place water and fertilizer at the roots of each seedling. Another attachment marks the line on which the next row of trees is to be planted. No cost figures are available yet, but officials say that the cost will be much less than when planting is done by hand. It is stated that the machine can be used on any land which has been cleared and is not too rough to plow and harrow. Our Want Ads bring results.

Weather Bureau to Work With Forest Service Against Fires.

The United States Weather Bureau in Portland is to co-operate more closely than ever with the forest service in combating forest fires. Warnings of weather conditions will be issued daily by Weather Forecaster Beals.

In order that accurate forecasts may be made by the Portland office nine of the forest lookout stations in different sections of this district will be equipped with apparatus for telling weather conditions. The rangers at those stations will take observations and notify Mr. Beals.
