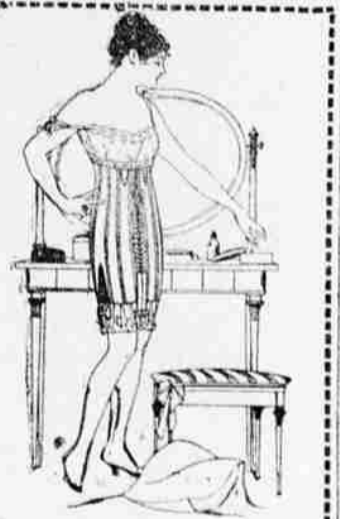

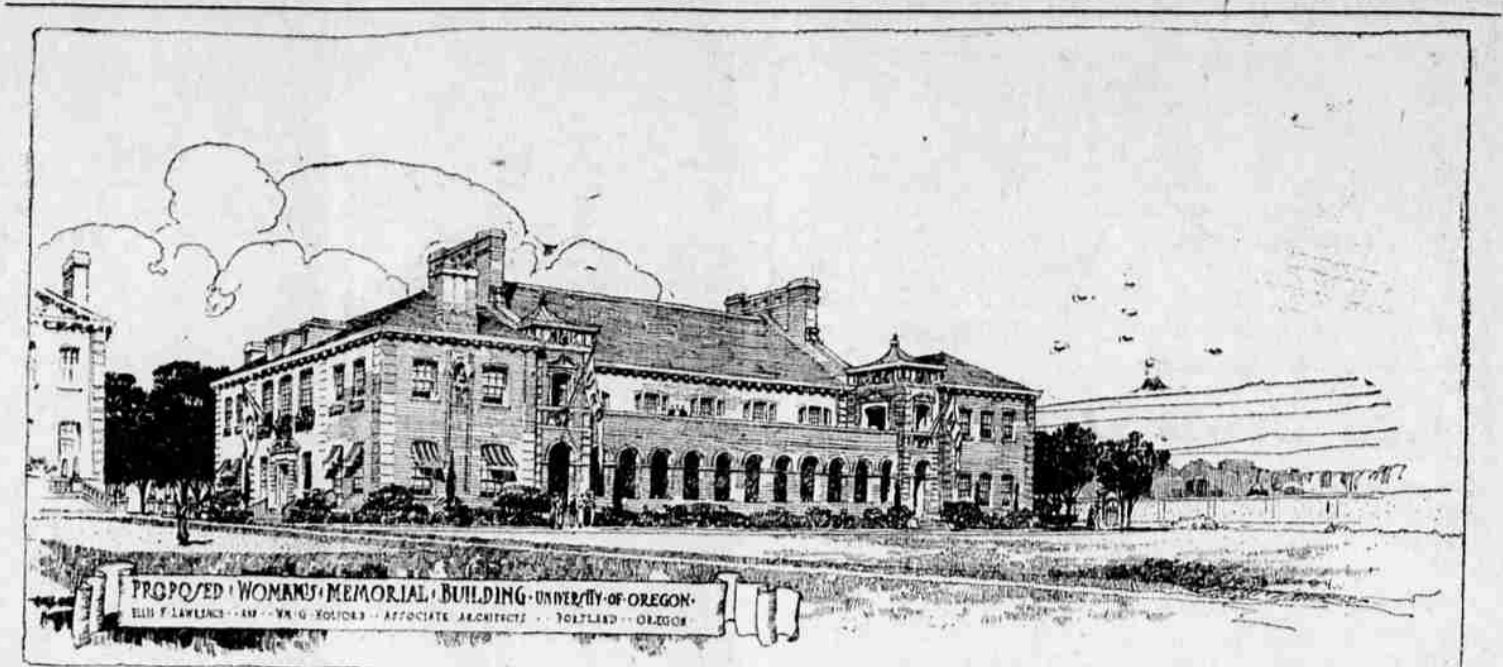

La Grande Women's Donation Brings Memorial Building Fund To \$7,000.00



University of Oregon, Eugene, June 19.—The Women's Neighborhood club of La Grande by making a donation of \$75.00 has just sent the fund which the women of the state are raising for a state women's building at the University of Oregon up past the \$7,000 mark. This amount, however, does not represent the whole of the women's accomplishments in their effort to build this structure since Mrs. George T. Gerlinger, of Dallas, was appointed the first woman regent the University has ever had, and immediately took hold of the campaign to raise \$100,000 by private subscription. There are numerous pledges that have been received to the effect that subscriptions will be forthcoming in amounts not stated, or a little later in the

campaign or in conjunction with other subscriptions. The total financial effect of the first year of effort on the part of the women is estimated as the equivalent of raising \$20,000 towards the Women's building.

An interesting feature of the women's campaign is the large amount raised by the undergraduate girls now in the University. This has already reached over \$1,500, most of it acquired by the giving of concerts and other entertainments.

In the whole list of donors appears the name of only one person of the masculine persuasion, Walter Winslow, a Salem attorney who is president of the University Alumni association, put his name down for \$25. The following is the list of contributors to date in so far as promises
