MUD HARMS THE SEWER

GARAGES MAY HAVE TO CHANGE PRACTICES.

City Commission Meets to Go Over Weekly Business Affairs.

Little of importance came before the meeting of city commission last evening. The question of preventing garages washing mud from automobiles into the sewers came up and an ordinance preventing that practice will likely be introduced. It is said that the practice has caused considerable harm to the sewer system. The remonstrance recently filed against the proposed sewer in District 5, Section 3, was reported back by the city manager and city engineer, showing that 37 1-2 per cent of the property owners had objected, and as it requires 55 per cent to block improvements, the commission moved to proceed with the work.

A refund of \$5.00 to Jake Nibler was ordered, it being shown that amount was due him on charges for assessments.

The city has purchased an engineer's transit, to replace one that was leased.

Dr. G. L. Tufts, of Portland, who is campaigning the state in behalf of a better Sunday rest law, will address a union mass meeting at the Baptist church tonight. Everybody is invited. Operation of Bingham Tax Law

Salem, Or., June 21.—Petitions for the initiation of constitutional amendments extending the Bingham tax law to all tax-levying agencies, and creating a system of rural credits, have been approved as to form by Secretary of State Olcott.

The amendment extending the Bingham tax law is being initiated by the State Taxpayer's league. The Bingham law excepts the legislature and cities from its operations, and the amendment covers them, as well as all other tax-levying districts. Under the amendment all tax levying powers are forbidden to make a levy which shall be 6 per cent greater than that of any one of two previous years, save by a vote of the people.

The rural credits amendment is being initiated by the Oregon Referendum league.
