**PIONEERS ORGANIZED IN MAY 1890  
 26TH ANNUAL REUNION IS NEAR**

The Union County Pioneer association was organized at Union on the 24th day of May, 1890, and the reunion to be held at Riverside park on Monday, July 3rd, will be the 27th annual meeting of the association. The following were the officers elected at the first meeting: General J. H. Stevens, President; E. S. McComas, secretary; Ben Brown, treasurer; all of whom are deceased.

It was decided that all those who settled in Union county prior to Jan. 1, 1870, should be eligible to membership. Later the requirements were so modified as to permit the enrollment of members in the county prior to 1875.

With this liberal allowance for eligibility the first roll of membership contained 343 names, a considerable number of whom were designated as "native born." They were the children of the pioneers. Still out of the first list of nearly 350, 26 years ago, 204 are dead and the remainder—but little more than a third of the original number—are still living.

It will thus be seen that while there still remains a substantial number of those who were among the early settlers of Grande Ronde the list is growing smaller year by year and the time to show honor and appreciation of those remaining is now.

La Grande's citizenship, both the element composed of pioneers and their descendants as well as those who came later are imbued with the feeling of highest regard for those who were at the forefront while the imperial Grande Ronde was in the making.

Committees are at work to make the 27th annual gathering a social success and a tribute to the remaining members of the original roll.
