CITIZENS IN DRILL NIGHTLY

NEW MEN DROP IN AND SOME COME REGULARLY.

Organization Night Next Wednesday Looked Forward to.

It is surprising to note the amount of interest being taken in the Citizens' drill company. Last evening in the fact of many counter attractions a big squad was out to get instruction from Drill Master Ralph Huron and others. In several instances the same individuals have been out three successive nights, but now ones continue to drop in and the organization night July 5th will unquestionably be a big affair.

Enterprise Company Talked Of. Enterprise, June 30.—The Chief said last night:

A militia company cannot be organized in Enterprise at once, but there is good prospect of it some time in the near future. This is the conclusion drawn from reading a letter by Adjutant General George A. White, received here on Tuesday. A telegram had been sent to General White on Saturday stating that nearly 65 men had signed for a prospective company, following Friday night's meeting at the court house. Gen. White wrote:

"I have been advised by the War Department that the formation of new Infantry companies at present is held in abeyance. However, a later call may come, or if it does not, the future development of the militia under the new army bill will give the state a large number of additional troops, and I wish to assure you and the others concerned, that Enterprise will receive careful consideration."

The letter also asked for any information relating to the availability of suitable men, army facilities, etc. Those who are interested in the proposed company contemplate effecting an organization for drilling, and seeking quarters where they can meet for the purpose, so they will be in position to be transferred into the Oregon National Guard when the time comes. Steps to form new companies in Pendleton and La Grande were taken last week, as here and Gen. White has written to both cities as he wrote to Enterprise. La Grande men propose to form a citizens' drill company.

The move for a militia company came to a sudden head last Thursday when a telegram was received by G. E. Odle, who had written to ask, that permission be granted to organize a company here. The Adjutant General wired asking how many men would join such a company. A citizens' meeting therefore was called Friday night for a discussion of the matter.

Mayor G. W. Hyatt presided and called on Dr. C. T. Hockett to explain the organization of the militia. He told that it costs nothing to join a company, and that all equipment is furnished and expenses paid by the state and national government. Mr. Odle was called on to tell of the correspondence with Gen. White, which had resulted in the meeting. Daniel Boyd, Rev. J. S. Axtel and F. A. Clarke spoke along the lines of the duty of the citizen to his country. Lostine sent a dozen men to the gathering and H. W. Shutt bespoke their interest. A Fairchild was the last speaker and he closed by putting his name on the paper prepared for those who wished to sign for membership in the proposed company, and inviting others to do the same.
