## ADAM M. PAUL PASSES AWAY

PICTURESQUE WESTERN CHARACTER IS DEAD.

Pony Express Rider, Railroad and Miner, Lived Here Once.

Adam Paul, one of the truly picturesque pioneers of the west, Black Hawk War veteran, mining man and

railroad builder, early pony express rider, and prominent Socialist, is dead at the home of his daughter in Los Angeles, according to news received here. Interment will take place in Los Angeles. Mr. Paul, born in Scotland, October 8, 1838, came to Ohio with his parents when a boy, and in 1859 they immigrated to Utah where Mr. Paul affiliated himself with express riding for the Wells Fargo mined and helped build the Shortline and the U. P. He worked for Brigham Young, planting many of the trees that tower in Liberty park. Ten years ago he moved to La Grande, and seven years later to Los Angeles after his wife died here.
