

DODGE CITY RACES FAST

NEW MARK FOR HUNDRED MILE EVENT SET.

Irving Yanks on Harley Davidson Wins First Place Yesterday.

The Dodge City motorcycle races, rated as the premier motorcycle classic of the whole world, and which is universally seconded by the La Grande classic, were run yesterday at Dodge City with Irving Yanke the winner. This big show has been the cynosure of all motor eyes for several weeks, and now interest shifts to the La Grande meet.

The Harley Davidson factory this morning notified Chase Bohnenkamp, vice president of the Speed 'Em Up and agent for the Harley, of the chief results at Dodge City. Says the telegram:

"Irving Yanke, on a Harley Davidson eight valve, wins in 3:45:36 for an average of 81 miles per hour, lowering former record 10 minutes and nine seconds. Ray Weisharr, on a Harley, eight-valve, made a new hundred-mile record, one hour, 11 minutes and 45 seconds, lowering former record two minutes and 45 seconds, averaging 83 and one-third miles per hour."

GOOD SAMARITAN ROBBED

Woman Gives Free Automobile Ride to Boys But Costs Her \$50

New York, June 25.—Justice Ryan in the Children's Court announced that the boys of Jamaica, L. I., needed a lesson. Thereupon he committed two youths to the house of Refuge and remanded two others to the custody of the Children's Society. The youths were accused of having stolen a pocketbook containing \$50 from Mrs. Hazel Simons, of Rockville Center, after she had allowed them a free ride in her automobile.

James Daly, 15 years old, of No. 342 Washington street, Jamaica, and John Myers, same age, 160 Union Hall street, each of whom have been before the justice twice before, were committed to the House of Refuge, while Vincent Daly, James' younger brother, and George Lesosky, 15, of 195 Washington street, Jamaica, were remanded. The police are looking for fifth boy!

The evidence yesterday developed that Mrs. Simons was driving her automobile in the Merrick road several days ago, when the five boys asked her to let them ride. She granted their request and they climbed in the rear of the vehicle. They rode through Valley Stream and almost to Lynbrook before getting out. Soon after they left Mrs. Simons missed her pocketbook containing \$50. She drove almost to Rockville Center, when she met a man friend and told him that her money had been taken. He accompanied her back toward Jamaica seeking a trace of the boys. They got no trace of them until after crossing the New York City line. There a motorcycle policeman recalled that he had seen five boys riding on the rear of a motor truck. Mrs. Simons and the policeman chased the truck and as they were overhauling it the boys saw them. They leaped to the street and scattered. As a result there had to be separate chases and the older Daly, Myers and Lesosky were caught. Their clothing contained \$35. Later the younger Daly boy was arrested. He denied having taken any of the money, but the other boys said he received his share. The fifth boy escaped.
