STICK THRUST INTO THROAT

BAKER LAD UNDERGOES PAINFUL ACCIDENT.

Liquor Seized in Raid Will Be Destroyed Say Officials.

Baker, July 6.—While playing in the rear of his home in South Baker last night, Norval, the four year old son of Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Shurtliff, Jr., tripped and fell, and the wooden handle of a toy windmill held in his mouth, was jammed into his throat, gashing it badly. Medical assistance was summoned at once, and several stitches were taken in closing the wound.

The youngster is reported to be doing well today, and to be out of danger.

Would Destroy Liquor.

A motion to be presented in municipal court seeking an order authorizing the destruction of 15 gallons of whisky found by the police last night in a trunk at the O.-W. R. & N. depot on a baggage check taken from Chas. Olds, was prepared today by City Attorney C. H. McCulloch. According to law five days' notice must be given Olds and the railroad company, before the motion may be argued in court.

Olds, who was arrested by Chief Jackson and Officer Caviness last night, is still in the city jail. At the time of his arrest a suit case with two quarts of whisky and a number of empty bottle containers, was found in his room, but he denied the ownership of the liquor. This morning he asserted that the baggage check taken from him had been given him by an acquaintance, who requested him to bring the trunk from the depot. The charge on which he is now held is that of maintaining a nuisance.

District Attorney Godwin declared this morning that as far as the state is concerned, no action will be taken against Olds. "We knew that there was liquor in the trunk for Constable Jefferis and Sheriff Anderson had ascertained this yesterday morning but were waiting for the owner of the stuff to claim it so as to make a clear case. As it now stands, Olds has not made any attempt to get possession of the liquor and the transaction has not been completed by the commission of an overt act."
