R. E. Reynolds, of O. A. C. Becomes Laramie Co. Agent

Laramie county, Wyoming, has secured the services of R. E. Reynolds, extension livestock specialist at O. A. C., as county agriculturist. Mr. Reynolds was graduated from the Animal Husbandry department in 1908. He then returned to the home farm in Union county till 1913, when he went to the University of Wisconsin, where he did graduate work. He was then offered the position he now holds. By his exceptional skill and pleasing personality he has made many friends in the institution and for it. He has helped farmers produce better livestock, showed how to reduce production cost, and has assisted them to form livestock shipping associations. His going is regretted by the head of the department, Professor Potter, and other college officers, but the heavy increase in salary cannot be met with the funds at hand. The Laramie authorities offer a salary equal to that of the head of the department. "They have too much money for us," said Professor Potter, "and we can't compete." Laramie county being essentially a livestock county, Mr. Reynolds will find the work congenial.

How Italy Hates Austria

Austria and Italy are at each other's throats. And not for the first time. Italy has always hated Austria, as the ill-treated small boy hates the school bully. Here is a story from the San Francisco News Age of October 6, 1866, when Austria still ruled Northern Italy, which gives an odd sidelight on this hate:

"As a proof of Austrian unpopularity in Venetia, it is related that a ballet dancer at Venice, while dancing at the theater there, had a bouquet thrown her, tied with a ribbon in the Italian colors. She immediately kissed the ribbon, which created tremendous enthusiasm among the audience.

"After the performance she was called to the police office, and sharply reprimanded for this act of patriotism. She excused herself by saying that in kissing the bouquet she had only followed the universal custom on such occasions; but the authorities would not accept this excuse, and told her that another time she should not kiss the bouquet, but tread it underfoot.

"The following evening another bouquet was thrown, and the dancer, in compliance with her instructions, trod it under foot, again amidst frantic applause. The ribbon around the bouquet was, however, this time not red, green and white, but black and yellow—the colors of Austria."

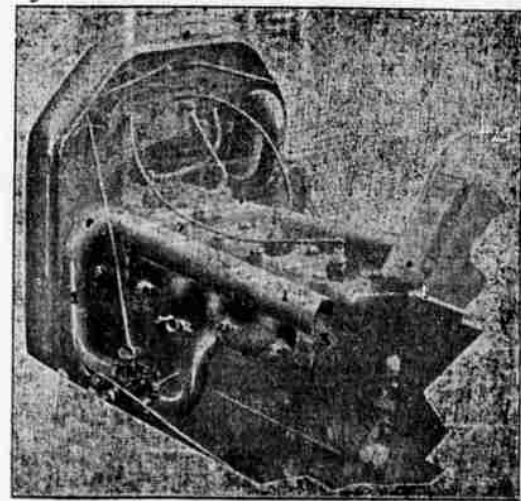
