Grazing Trespass Case Closed

Barney Parks of Harney, Oregon, indicted for willful grazing trespass upon the Malheur National Forest, pleaded guilty and was fined \$50 by the United States court on June 19. Parks paid his fine and the case is closed.

Parks was in charge of sheep going to their allotted range, and instead of following the regularly established driveway, trailed them across the allotted cattle range of other stock owners, consuming four or five days in crossing and using about \$100 worth of forage on the cattle men's allotment. Instead of holding the sheep owner, who had no part in the action, responsible for the willful feature of the case, the government brought trespass charges against the camp-tender with the result mentioned above. This is the second case in which an employe has been held responsible for a trespass of this sort in Oregon. It is believed that this Court decision, fixing the responsibility upon the man in charge of the stock will stimulate employes to comply with regulations and instructions when handling stock on National Forest range.

In the past, when herders or others in charge of stock have refused to observe the regulations and trespassed upon range allotted to another stockman, the owner of the stock was held entirely responsible. The government has now adopted the plan of segregating such cases and criminally prosecuting the man in charge of the stock when he acts on his own authority and wilfully violates the grazing regulations.

The government undertakes to give grazing permittees quiet possession of the range allotted to them for the use of their stock, and the action in this case was necessary for the protection of the cattle men whose allotted range was trespassed upon by the sheep.

This play is exceptional in that the fencing is not between a couple as in some dramas but between many men and all of them skillful.

Accidental Discharge of Firearms Leaves Two Suffering

Sumpter, July 10.—Two accidents, the results of premature discharge of firearms, marred the perfect day, which lured many to the woods from here yesterday. Neither of the gunshot wounds is necessarily dangerous.

The first to be reported, occurred yesterday afternoon a short distance out of the city, when Mrs. A. H. Haley was instructing Miss Opal Wood in the manipulation of a 22 calibre rifle. In some way the hammer slipped and Mrs. Haley's daughter, 12 year old Freda Studer, received the bullet in her arm, the leaden pellet fracturing the bone. An anaesthetic was administered, the bullet removed and the fracture reduced.

The second injury took place on Olive Lake. Fred Hunter, believed to be from Pendleton, finding that the fish had ceased to bite, allowed his line to trail from his boat while he amused himself by shooting at objects along the shore with his 38 calibre revolver. Suddenly a trout nibbled, then pulled hard and Hunter reached precipitately for his expensive steel rod, just on the point of being pulled overboard. As he reached, the cartridge in his gun was exploded, the bullet passing through the fleshy part of his leg, entirely missing any bone, or even an important blood vessel.

Hunter applied first aid, made his way to Sumpter, and there received more expert attention.
