

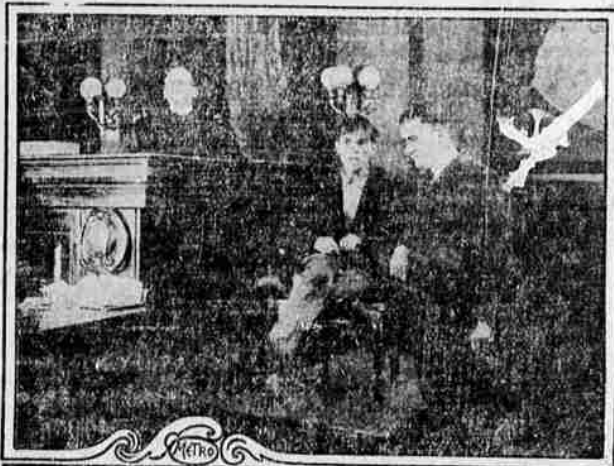

### Wives of English Soldiers Suffer

London, July 14.—Despite the provision the British government is supposed to make for the wives and families of its men at the front, an expose in the labor "Herald" today would indicate that some of England's women and children feel the pinch of poverty during wartime quite as much as thousands of American militiamen's wives and children feel it since their bread-winners have been called to the Mexican border.

The allegations concerning the alleged pension evils are attracting the attention not only of labor union, but of government officials. The Herald gives a long list of inadequate pension and says:

"If this kind of thing happens while the war is on and men are needed, what must happen when peace is declared and the services of men in the army and navy are no longer required?"

### Pickle Prospects Poor

Chicago, July 14.—If Peter Piper gets over in the cucumber patch and picks a peck of pickles while picking pickled peppers these days he'll have to pay a fancy price for them.

The National Pickle Packer's association met here today and announced to the world at large and lovesick swains and lassies in particular, that there is a dearth of pickles in the land. As a result, the packers are a trifle soured on the universe. They advocate the conversation of every single wart. Their cry is "Save the Dill; and let the vinger drip where it may."

The pickle men are here to figure out a way to save the day and provide for the shortage of stock. Bad pickle weather for the last two years is blamed for the short crops. Every gardener who values the esteem of these pickle men will grow great quantities of cucumbers from now on.

The situation is being watched with exceeding great interest by co-eds at the university of Chicago, where the consumption of pickles and ice cream is said to exceed that of all other colleges. ### Milling in Transit Rates Made By Road

Portland, July 12.—As soon as the statutory requirements can be compiled with, which will be in about 40 days hence, the Oregon-Washington Rail Road & Navigation company will put into effect milling in transit rates on lumber and lumber products from points on its lines to Intermountain and Eastern points reached by the Union Pacific system. The effect will be that several manufacturing industries in Portland and lumber dealers in the mountain states and beyond will be saved local rates to Portland or other milling points and lumber producers will have additional means for expanding trade. The new rule will apply to lumber moved from points on the railway system to Portland or other like points for milling, sorting, dry kilning or fabricating purposes to points of destination at the usual through rate applicable to lumber in each instance, plus a nominal charge for stopping in transit. The minimum charge for stoppage is 1 cent per 100 pounds for any distance up to 30 miles, ranging up to 2 1/2 cents for distances up to 250 miles from point to origin. This concession, granted on the plea of representative lumber producers, will be advantageous to manufacturers of wooden pipe and staple commodities fabricated from lumber.

### Sioux Indians on the Wagon.

St. Paul, Minn., July 15.—Mata Ciquana, full blooded Sioux Indian, is on his way here today to tell the Prohibition National convention delegates that the Sioux are on the water wagon for good and all. Mata will recount in a speech how "Minnie Quahan," which is Sioux for "Mysterious Water," has cursed the tribe for years, but is now and for some time has been cursed by the bucks. Ciquana, called by his tribesmen "Little Bear" because he is six feet tall, almost as broad and weighs 220 pounds, is an auditor, author, farmer, stenographer, printer, traveler and a baseball and football fan. His business name is de Witt Hare and he owns 200 acres of \$80 land near Wagner, S. D. He is a Presbyterian, a temperance advocate and graduate of Huron, S. D., college.

Knowles didn't want the women with him so he chose one of them, Mrs. Emily Davis, whose husband was killed in the fighting in Northern France recently and who is an experienced woodswoman, to take charge of the six Eves after he has chosen a camp for them and left preliminary instructions in the art of finding edible roots and how to make snares, traps and fish nets of grasses and fibre. ### To Double Size of San Francisco.

San Francisco, July 15.—A plan to more than double the area of San Francisco is to be considered by a municipal committee here today and reported on not later than August 1. It is an annexation project similar to the borough system in New York City. From San Francisco southward along what is known as the peninsula extends an almost uninterrupted line of small municipalities including Redwood City, San Mateo, Burlingame, Daly City, Menlo Park, South San Francisco and San Bruno. The plan is to bring them into the city by incorporating San Francisco and San Mateo counties. Representative committees have been appointed to draft a bill for presentation to the legislature, authorizing the incorporation. This committee includes officials of the cities and towns involved. Better water and transportation are among the inducements offered.
