Rev. Cornelison is Moderator

Eugene, Or., July 19.—Rev. James M. Cornelison, of the Tutulla Mission, on the Umatilla Indian reservation, yesterday was elected moderator of the Presbyterian synod of Oregon, in session here. Rev. Joseph Diven, of Albany was elected reporting clerk.

With the election of the moderator the synod began its real work. The morning sessions having been devoted to preliminary business and lectures by university speakers.

Action on the proposed union of Albany College, at Albany and the Pacific University, at Forest Grove, will be taken up later in the week.

Pacific University was founded in 1848, and until eight years ago was a Congregational institution, but of late has been nonsectarian. As a nonsectarian institution it has raised an endowment of \$200,000. Albany College as a Presbyterian institution, has an endowment of \$250,000.

Such a merger has been considered in previous years. Congregationalists in Portland and the people of Albany were opposing such a step at this time. Dr. Calvin H. French, secretary of the

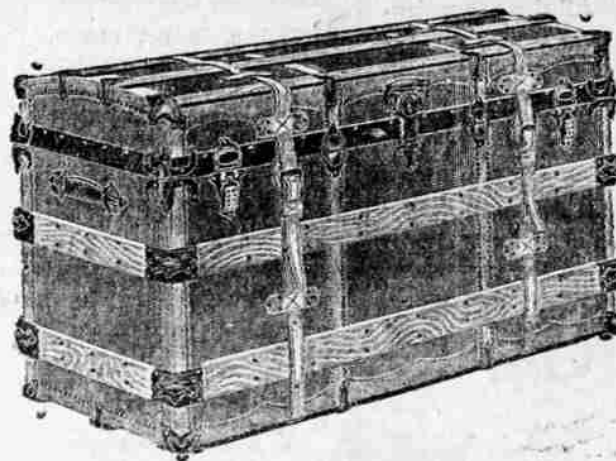
**Recruiting Squads Ready**

Camp Withcombe, Or., July 19.—Five hundred letters are en route today to as many able bodied young Oregonians, urging them to don Uncle Sam's khaki and enlist. When the letters have paved the way, four recruiting squads will start from this camp and canvass every nook of the state seeking new soldiers. The recruiters plan to begin their personal labors tomorrow. An official check of the Oregon National Guard units at the Mexican border showed they were

800 men short and that the number would probably grow to 1000 when those with persons dependent on them for support were relieved. The four recruiting squads are confronted with the task of getting 1000 enlistments to fill those vacancies.
