STATE SECRETARY ISSUES COMPARISON

Umatilla and Wallowa Lead Over Union County

With one car to every 23 individuals Union county is seventh in the state in the relative ratio by counties. When Secretary of State Ben Olcott last week issued license tags 30,000 he announced that this state has one automobile for every 28 of its people. This is based on a population of 823,000.

The relative ratio by counties showing how many people are represented by a car, is as follows:

Jimmie Dime and Brigade of Battlers Off for Australia Today

San Francisco, July 25.—Accompanied by his fighting brigade, Jimmie Dime of New Castle, Pa., silver-maker-and-breaker of pugilistic lights, set sail aboard the Sonoma today for Australia. Included in the party of pugilists were ex-Champion of the middleweight division, George Chip; light-heavyweight, "B-arcat" Tom McMahon; middleweight, Joe Chap; welterweight, Johnny Riley; lightweight, Tommy Toubie; featherweight, "Babe" Picato and bantamweight, Patsy Brannigan. For the service of the seven battlers, Dime has been guaranteed \$16,000, with the privilege of accepting 25 per cent of the gross receipts. The fighting brigade will remain in Australia for six months, returning to the United States about Christmas, probably via Shanghai, China, where several exhibition bouts will be staged. Chip is guaranteed \$10,000 for four bouts, the other boys, \$1,000 each for five bouts.

Czar and Mikado to Rule Far East

Tokio, Japan, July 21 (Friday), 10 a. m.—The concluding of the Russo-Japanese Convention, the object of which is to unify the efforts of the two countries to maintain peace in the Far East, has been enthusiastically celebrated in the principal cities of the empire. Mammoth manifestations were held in Tokio, Yokohama and Osaka.

Marquis Okuma, the Premier, in discussing the convention, said that it not only guarantees permanent peace in the Far East, but will contribute to the peace of the whole world. He things it signifies paramount possession by Japan and Russia in the Orient.

Premier Okuma expressed the opinion that the peace of Europe will be restored before long.
