S. N. Bolton came in last night from his present headquarters in Riverside, Oregon, and will remain for a brief period on business matters.

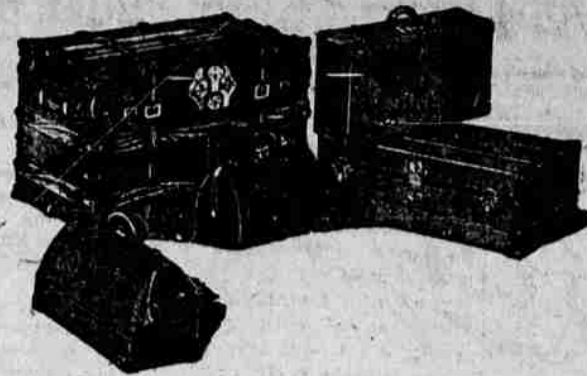
L. Couch, Wallowa real estate dealer and brother of County Assessor U. G. Couch, was in La Grande this morning enroute home from a business trip to Portland.
