New York, August 5.—Republican Nominee Hughes started his stumping tour today. It will carry him across the country to the Pacific Coast and back again, with a few days' vacation sandwiched in between times, at some spot in Glacier National Park, Montana.

Originally Candidate Hughes planned a dignified speaking tour with set appeals for votes in only a dozen or so of the big cities en route to the Pacific Coast. He expects to remain a day or so in each of these large cities conferring with local leaders. But the moment he announced a transcontinental tour he began being

bombarded with appeals from Republicans for speeches in their home towns—and today it appeared that Hughes would do a regular "barnstorming" tour—rear platform speeches and all.

Four years ago Colonel Roosevelt established a precedent for liveliness in transcontinental tours and with Hughes' ability as a campaigner his friends were betting today he would equal if not better the Rooseveltian record for strenuously in speaking dates.

With the Governor travels Mrs. Hughes. It is a bran new departure for the wife of a candidate to be with him on campaign tours. But Mrs. Hughes has always been one of her husband's most trusted advisers and assistants in mapping political strategy, and besides she wanted to see that he kept well, so it was decided to have her along. Governor and Mrs. Hughes, two secretaries, a messenger, the Governor's personal press agent, Carl D. Sheppard, formerly a Washington newspaperman, and a messenger will occupy one private car on the trip. Hitched on to this will be another private car for politicians, local committees, and newspapermen.

On Monday, Governor Hughes will make the first set campaign speech of the season at Detroit. Tuesday he will speak in Chicago, and then he goes to St. Paul.

Oil Mixed Concrete for Highways  
Washington, Aug. 7.—Concrete as a road-building material is of "perhaps more universal adaption" than any other material now in use, said Director Logan Walter Page, of the Office of Public Roads of the United States Department of Agriculture today.

Concrete, as sized up by the department, has the following advantages:  
1. Durability under ordinary conditions.  
2. A smooth, even surface, not too slippery.  
3. Practically no dust.  
4. Is easily cleaned and maintained at small cost until a patching or re-

surfacing becomes necessary.  
5. A pleasing appearance.  
6. Forms an excellent basis for other materials when resurfacing becomes necessary.  
Its disadvantages are as follows:  
1. Noisy under horse traffic.  
2. Difficult to repair.  
3. Cracks must be given prompt attention or deterioration will ensue.  
Improved concrete for road building as well as for other purposes, that is proof against water absorption has been announced by the department in oil-mixed concrete.  
After extensive experiments with a

view to producing a non-absorbent concrete mixture, the department found that the addition of ten per cent of heavy, mineral oil to the Portland cement paste acted as an effective repellent to moisture. The susceptibility of concrete to water absorption had long been recognized as one of its inherent weaknesses as a road-building material.  
The addition of the oil does not lower the tensile strength, the department has found, and has the further advantage of making the mixture impervious to the destructive action of alkali salts.
